Agenda Item 7: UNIDO and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development

Mr President,

The Republic of South Africa remains committed to the UN's Agenda 2030 especially as we move towards growing our economy and society. Our 6th Administration has embarked on implementing sectorial masterplans that focuses on key industrial sectors of our economy so that we focus on our strengths and efforts in collaboration with organised labour, industry and other stakeholders to ensuring the promotion of inclusive and sustainable economic development. We are also on the path to ensure that the state apparatus is not abused and that it is indeed an enabling contributor to building as sustainable economy – within this context we are working collaboratively with stakeholders to ensure our industrial development works to address the triple challenge of poverty, inequality and unemployment that South Africa faces.
