

**Indonesian Statement
At the 48th Session of the IDB UNIDO**

Agenda 7: UNIDO and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development

Mr. President.

Thank you for the opportunity.

The Indonesian Delegation associates itself with the statement of the G-77 and China and would like to add the following in its national capacity.

Since the adoption of the Sustainable Development Goals 2030, the world has had a vision and ambition to achieve a balance between three pillars: environmental, social and economic. UNIDO's mandate of helping its member to achieve Inclusive and Sustainable Industrial Development (ISID) is anchored within the SDGs 2030.

The cross-cutting issues under UNIDO 's purview have made it a unique contributor to the achievement of SDGs, particularly Goal 9: Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure. Furthermore, UNIDO also contributes to the achievement of other Goals such as:

Goal 1: End Poverty

Which means industrial development must contribute to poverty eradication.

Goal 6: Clean Water and Sanitation

In which industry has the obligation to process the liquid waste it produces.

Goal 11: Sustainable Cities and Communities

In which industry has a role in controlling the emissions it produces

Goal 12: Responsible Consumption and
Production

In which industry has a role to abide by multilateral environment agreements on chemicals and hazardous waste

Goal 13: Climate Action

In which industry has a role in controlling the emissions it produces and contributing to the collection of data on the amount of emissions from its activities

Mr. President.

Indonesia-UNIDO Country Program 2016-2020 has been aligned with Indonesia's Medium National Development Planning Agenda which is focused on four components: (1) Poverty Alleviation, (2) Energy for all, (3) Environment and Production, (4) Partnership and Sustainable Development.

For the next Country Program 2021-2025, it will be aligned with Indonesia's Medium National Development Planning Agenda 2020-2024 and SDGs 2030. The Indonesian government believes that collaboration with UNIDO and partners will help Indonesia achieve Inclusive and Sustainable Industrial Development, especially in implementing the green industry policy.

The green industry is the goal of national industrial development in accordance with Government Regulation NO.14/2015 regarding the Master Plan for National Industrial Development for 2021-2035.

Indonesia will implement several programs such as the application of green industries to both existing industries and building new industries with green industry principles, green industry certification and granting both fiscal and non-fiscal facilities for the green industry.
