EU Statement on

Agenda item 18: Recommendation of a candidate for the post of Director General

Vienna, 12 July 2021

Madam President,

I have the honour to speak on behalf of the European Union and its Member States. The following countries align themselves with this statement: the Republic of North Macedonia^{*}, Montenegro^{*}, Serbia^{*}, Albania^{*}, Bosnia and Herzegovina^{*}, Ukraine, the Republic of Moldova and Armenia.

Allow me to welcome you as President of this 49th Session of the Industrial Development Board, which is tasked with the responsibility to recommend a candidate for the post of UNIDO Director General. We are confident that under your able leadership, a fair, transparent and inclusive election process will be ensured.

We would like to thank the outgoing President, Ambassador Djumala of Indonesia, for his commendable efforts to pave the way for a smooth election and the UNIDO Secretariat for their professional and impartial work in preparing this important session.

Today's election marks the end of an inspiring campaign of three outstanding candidates. The European Union and its Member States are united in their support for Dr. Gerd Müller, Federal Minister for Economic Cooperation and Development of Germany, to become the next Director General of UNIDO.
