**Agenda item 18: Recommendation of a candidate for the post of Director General
(Congratulatory Statement)**

Vienna, 12-15 July 2021

Madam President,

I have the honour to speak on behalf of the European Union and its member States. The following countries align themselves with this statement: the Republic of North Macedonia*, Montenegro*, Serbia*, Albania*, Bosnia and Herzegovina*, Norway+, Ukraine, the Republic of Moldova, Armenia and Georgia.

I would like to extend our warmest congratulations to Dr. Gerd Müller on his election as the next UNIDO Director General and to welcome him as the first ever DG from the Group of Western European and Other States (WEOG), supported by the European Union and its Member States. We look forward to his appointment at the 19th General Conference and wish him every success in his new position.
