AREAS OF STRENGTH

- **Significant progress** in improving the coordination, communication, execution and reporting mechanisms
- Good representation, commitment and participation of UNIDO in UNCTS* and UNDAFS*
- Opportunities for valuable engagement in delivering on UNIDO's ISID* and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development

AREAS FOR IMPROVEMENT

- **Divergent perspectives** on UNIDO Field Offices in terms of mandates, resources and expected results
- **UNIDO's contribution** to the UNDS* at the country-level varies widely by office-type and resource availability
- Financial and human resources available to the Field Network not proportionate with the duties assigned to them
- Systematic monitoring and reporting on results and impact and on the extent of contribution to the achievement of ISID is needed
- Limited access to technical expertise in the field

 - * ISID: Inclusive and Sustainable Industrial Development
