## **Personnel matters: UNIDO Staff Pension Committee**

### **Report by the Director General**

The present document provides information on the representation of the General Conference on the UNIDO Staff Pension Committee.

## **I. Representation of the General Conference on the UNIDO Staff Pension Committee**

1. By decision GC.1/Dec.37, the General Conference accepted the regulations of the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund and established the UNIDO Staff Pension Committee. By decision GC.19/Dec.17, the General Conference elected two members of the UNIDO Staff Pension Committee for the biennium 2022–2023 and authorized the Industrial Development Board to elect new members and alternate members of the Staff Pension Committee for any of the posts that might become vacant before the twentieth session of the Conference.

2. In accordance with paragraph (b) of decision GC.19/Dec.17, on 23 November 2022, the Industrial Development Board elected two alternate members of the UNIDO Staff Pension Committee for the remainder of the biennium 2022–2023 (IDB.50/Dec.8). No elections for the UNIDO Staff Pension Committee were held at the fifty-first session of the Board.
