I would like to recognize the important work of UNIDO, lead by Director General Gerd Müller, to promote Inclusive and Sustainable Industrial Development. I encourage UNIDO to seek even more tangible results.

We cannot afford steps backwards in gender equality. It would be unsustainable both humanly and economically.

Distinguished delegates,

UNIDO has a strong track-record of working with the private sector. Initiatives such as UNIDO's <u>Public Private Development Partnerships</u> are key to engaging with the private sector.

I am particularly looking forward to results from the ICT value chain project in Egypt. It is part of the <u>Switch to Circular Economy Value Chains</u> initiative funded by Finland and the EU.

UNIDO needs to be attractive and approachable to private business in order to increase resources, funding and jobs in partner countries.
