The General Conference, in compliance with rule 102.2 of its rules of procedure, and in replacement of the former Czechoslovakia, elected Slovakia as member to the Industrial Development Board to hold office until the close of the sixth regular session of the Conference in 1995.

GC/S.1/Dec.7 APPOINTMENT OF THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL

The General Conference adopted the recommendation contained in decision IDB.10/Dec.24 of the Industrial Development Board and decided to appoint by acclamation Mauricio de Maria y Campos as Director-General of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization for a period of four years from the first day of April 1993 or until the Director-General appointed at the seventh regular session of the General Conference assumes office, whichever is later.

The General Conference approved the contract annexed to the present decision establishing the terms and conditions of appointment of the Director-General, including the salary and other emoluments attached to the office.

CONTRACT FOR APPOINTMENT OF THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL

THIS CONTRACT is made

between the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (hereinafter called the Organization) for the one part and Mauricio de Maria y Campos (hereinafter called the Director-General) for the other part.

WHEREAS

The Director-General, upon recommendation of the Board, has been duly appointed by the Conference at its first special session held on 30 March 1993.

IT IS HEREBY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

1. Term of Office

The Director-General shall be appointed for a period of four years from the first day of April nineteen hundred and ninety-three (1993), or until the Director-General to be appointed at the seventh regular session of the General Conference assumes office, whichever is later.

2. Official Duty Station

The official duty station for the Director-General shall be Vienna, Austria.

3. Official Duties

In accordance with Article 11 of the Constitution of the Organization, the Director-General shall be the chief administrative officer of the Organization.

4. Privileges and Immunities

The Director-General shall enjoy all the privileges and immunities in keeping with his office as determined by the Constitution of the Organization, Article 21, and any relevant legal instruments already in force or to be concluded in the future.

5. Staff Regulations

The Director-General shall be subject to the Staff Regulations of the Organization, together with such amendments as may be made thereto, in so far as they are applicable to him.

6. Assessable Salary and Allowances

(a) The Director-General shall receive an annual gross salary of US dollars one hundred and eighty-three thousand one hundred and fifty-eight (183,158) corresponding to an annual net base salary equivalent to US dollars one hundred and five thousand and forty-two (105,042) (dependency rate) or US dollars ninety-three thousand three hundred and twenty-two (93,322) (single rate) respectively. The net base salary shall be adjusted whenever the General Assembly decides to incorporate multiplier points of post adjustment

into the base salary of staff in the Professional and higher categories;

- (b) He shall receive post adjustment, allowances and benefits, including social security benefits, for which a staff member in the Professional category of the UNIDO Secretariat would be eligible under the Staff Regulations and Staff Rules of the Organization, provided the purpose of such emolument, allowance or benefit has not already been met by other provisions of the present contract;
- (c) The Director-General shall receive a representation allowance of Austrian schillings three hundred and four thousand six hundred and sixty-seven (304,667) per annum, adjusted for the budgeted annual inflation rate, to meet his share of the obligations which the Organization incurs in the form of representation and hospitality expenditure;
- (d) He shall receive a housing allowance amounting to Austrian schillings four hundred and sixty-seven thousand one hundred and fifty-seven (467,157) per annum, adjusted for the budgeted annual inflation rate;
- (e) The above salary, allowances and benefits to which the Director-General is entitled under this agreement shall be subject to adjustment by the Board, after consultations with the Director-General, to keep them in line with those of the executive heads of other specialized agencies within the common system of the United Nations or of members of the staff of UNIDO in the Professional category, as the case may be.

7. Pension Arrangements

The Director-General shall participate in the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund in accordance with the provisions of decision IDB.10/Dec.17 (d) of the Industrial Development Board. His pensionable remuneration shall be determined in accordance with the guidelines approved by the International Civil Service Commission.

8. Notice of Resignation

The Director-General may at any time give three months' notice of resignation in writing to the Board, which is authorized to accept his resignation on behalf of the General Conference, in which case, upon expiration of such period of notice, he shall cease to be Director-General of the Organization and this contract shall terminate.

Entry into force

This contract shall enter into force as of the 1st day of April 1993.

RESOLUTION

GC/S.1/Res.1

PARTICIPATION OF THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF YUGOSLAVIA (SERBIA AND MONTENEGRO) IN THE PRINCIPAL AND SUBSIDIARY ORGANS OF THE UNITED NATIONS INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT ORGANIZATION

The General Conference,

Recalling resolution A/RES/47/1 of the United Nations General Assembly of 22 September 1992 — adopted upon the recommendation of the Security Council of 19 September 1992 (S/RES/777) — in which the General Assembly considered that the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) cannot continue automatically the membership of the former Socialist Federal Republic of

Yugoslavia in the United Nations and decided that the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) should apply for membership in the United Nations and that it shall not participate in the work of the General Assembly,

Considers that the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) cannot continue automatically the membership of the former Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia in UNIDO; and decides that the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) should apply for membership in UNIDO pursuant to article 3 of the Constitution of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization and that it shall not participate in the work of the Programme and Budget Committee, the Industrial Development Board and the General Conference of UNIDO.
