Poland associates itself with the statement delivered by the distinguished

remarks from our national perspective.

Poland is a reliable and active member of UNIDO. We participate in important events

organized by UNIDO, which constitute an added value to our membership. We highly

appreciated our participation in the Second Regional Conference for new development

partners in the European Union organized in June, we were also pleased in October

with the opportunity to co-organize in Warsaw the regional launch of the UNIDO

Industrial Development Report 2024 with participation of the Deputy Director General

Mr. Yuko Yasunaga and to take an active role as a speaker by a representative of the

Polish government at the UNIDO's Multilateral Industrial Policy Forum in Riyadh.

I would like to emphasize that as the 16th largest contributor to the regular budget of

UNIDO we always pay our assessed contributions in full amount and within the

indicated deadlines. Moreover, we traditionally allocate undeveloped budget funds -

the so called Unutilized Balances - for the implementation of UNIDO projects.

We have come a long way from being a beneficiary of UNIDO's activity to the position of a country which shares our knowledge with interested parties on how to transform their economies and which supports them financially within the scope of existing possibilities.

We have decided to get committed and involved into a project led by UNIDO for Rwanda, which is aimed to "Strengthen Rwanda's capacities to respond to industrial and natural hazards". In terms of the ongoing war and our support to Ukraine - apart from numerous activities undertaken on national level - we are engaged in the UNIDO's "Green Industrial Recovery Programme for Ukraine 2024-2028". We see this program as a very valuable and timely one and have decided to support It financially.

Poland is a dedicated member of UNIDO from the very beginning and wishes to reiterate its commitment to the goal of inclusive and sustainable industrial development. It is also worth to know that the principle of sustainable development is laid down in Article 5 of the Constitution of the Republic of Poland as a horizontal principle pointing out at a general guideline for all public policies.

We are looking forward to continue our intensive and effective cooperation with UNIDO.
