Thailand's Statement at the 52nd Session of the UNIDO Industrial Development Board 25 November 2024

Madam President,

1. Thailand would like to express our sincere congratulations on your election as the President of the 52nd Session of the IDB and to all members of the Bureau. Among these achievements are a remarkable 25% increase in technical cooperation activities and a record-high \$328.4 million in technical cooperation funds, marking an unprecedented milestone for UNIDO.

Thailand supports the strategic priorities of UNIDO, including clean energy and climate action, ending hunger, and building resilient and sustainable supply chains, which share a strong alignment with its Bio-Circular-Green Economic Model. Thailand reaffirms its commitment to working closely with UNIDO and believes that UNIDO's expertise can support the country in achieving these common goals.
- 5. Thailand urges UNIDO to expand technical cooperation to support sustainable industrial development, SMEs inclusion, and digital technology adoption, tailored to middle-income countries. As a host of UNIDO's Sub-Regional Office, Thailand underscores its vital role in supporting Member States and commends the appointment of a new Representative.
