Review Report: <u>Status of Evaluation Recommendations</u>, <u>MAPs</u>, <u>and Lessons Learned</u> and its <u>Infographic</u>

This review provides a comprehensive overview of the EIO evaluation recommendations, management action plans (MAPs), and lessons learned.

It covers 16 strategic and country evaluations and 137 project evaluations conducted by EIO from 2018 to 2023. The purpose of this review was to reveal trends and patterns and to identify areas for improvement on the acceptance, follow-up, and implementation of evaluation results.

Key findings highlight how only 282 out of 830 recommendations were implemented timely. The utilization of lessons learned post-issuance is not documented and therefore difficult to assess.

This suggests a need for enhanced follow-up mechanisms and the better integration of evaluation insights into operational practice.



Evaluation Report: <u>Third Industrial Development Decade for Africa – IDDA III</u> <u>2016-2025</u> and its <u>Infographic</u>

This report presents the independent strategic evaluation of the Third Industrial Development Decade for Africa (IDDA III), an initiative launched by the United Nations General Assembly to promote inclusive and sustainable industrial development (ISID) across Africa from 2016 to 2025.

The initiative, led in its execution by UNIDO, aims to overcome hindrances to ISID in Africa, including limited economic diversification, weak physical and economic infrastructure development, and shortages in human capital, among others. IDDA III leveraged strategic partnerships with the African Union, regional economic communities, and various international stakeholders to achieve its goals.

The evaluation concluded that IDDA III has been a relevant programme for ISID in Africa, and it is also coherent with existing major flagship frameworks. However, IDDA III fell short of its full potential due to the challenges faced in its implementation. The specific recommendations derived from the findings and conclusions include a need for better resource allocation to the coordination of future similar initiatives, the creation of a database for knowledge management, and a need for a programmatic approach in future initiatives. Moreover, the design of a potential successor to IDDA III should be radically different. It should follow the ECOSOC Guidelines for International Decades by allowing sufficient time between the proclamation of the decadal plan and the start of its implementation. It should also be framed within an enhanced African ownership, stronger governance and coordination, enhanced resource mobilization, and a robust monitoring and evaluation framework.



Evaluation Report: Impact of the Vienna Energy Forum

The independent evaluation assessed the impact of the International Vienna Energy and Climate Forum (IVECF), formerly Vienna Energy Forum (VEF), henceforth simply the forum, for the period 2009-2023 with a special focus on the last five years.

The forum's primary goal has been to create a vibrant, interactive, and inclusive environment that facilitates stimulating discussions on crucial issues related to the sustainable energy discourse and encourages the

proposal of practical solutions for promoting sustainable energy development.

The evaluation found that the forum is well-aligned with emerging global priorities on sustainable energy. It has seen significant growth in participation over the years, which spotlights its rising significance. The forum has catalyzed policy and technology discussions and community projects globally over the years through its insights and partnerships. It has contributed to the global sustainable energy agenda over the past decade, both through high-level policy impacts at international events like COP as well as through on-ground delivery. Through its platforms, various projects have gained visibility and access to potential support, exemplifying its capacity to facilitate meaningful connections and contribute to advancing sustainable energy solutions. Sustaining this impact hinges on expanding its reach and scope further. By exposing industry players to emerging innovations, this forum has also contributed to new product developments and sustained corporate engagement. However, overall data to comprehensively assess this forum's long-term impact remains constrained.



Evaluation Report: <u>Independent Country Evaluation of The People's Republic of China</u> and its <u>infographic</u>.

The evaluation assessed UNIDO's engagement in China from 2016 to 2024, focusing on its contributions through the Country Programs (CPs) and the ongoing Inclusive and Sustainable Industrial Development (ISID) program (2021-2025). It aimed to measure progress, inform future interventions, and guide the development of the next CP. The evaluation found that UNIDO made significant contributions to China's industrialization efforts. particularly in improving the performance of the manufacturing sector. fostering green growth and rural revitalization, and driving innovation. UNIDO also played a pivotal role in transitioning China from a recipient of development assistance to an active contributor to global sustainable development. However, challenges were identified in coordination, communication, and project management processes between UNIDO headquarters, its field office, and projects in China. The evaluation recommended strengthening project management and operational efficiency, establishing high-level industrial policy dialogues with Chinese ministries to address emerging trends, developing programs to help small and medium enterprises (SMEs) transition to greener production, and leveraging Fourth Industrial Revolution technologies to promote innovation-driven industrial growth.

UPDATED EVALUATION MANUAL

The latest update of the UNIDO <u>Evaluation Manual</u> has been published.

The UNIDO Evaluation Manual is designed to provide clarity and consistency for UNIDO staff, consultants, and management in their evaluation roles. It also offers insight to stakeholders, enhancing their understanding of the evaluation process and its impact on UNIDO's effectiveness.



IMPORTANT: UPDATED APPROACH TO INDEPENDENT EVALUATION AND SELF-EVALUATION IN UNIDO

EIO has updated the approach and requirements for evaluations and to further enhance value through more strategic and relevant independent evaluations and to further instill a results-based culture, including stronger monitoring and reporting of all TC projects or programmes as follows:

- Previous threshold of USD 2 million project volume for conducting an independent evaluation is no longer applicable
- All TC projects or programmes <u>must be evaluated</u>, either through a Self-Evaluation (SE) or an Independent Evaluation (IE)

- **EIO** will identify which projects/programmes will have an independent evaluation (IE) and inform the respective project management office/division/unit accordingly
- In case an independent evaluation is required by a funding partner, this needs to be reflected in the programme/project document and/or cooperation/funding agreement and such a requirement has to be agreed with and cleared by EIO accordingly

Note: EIO has engaged with **SPP/SPM** and will work with them as needed to further operationalize the UNIDO Monitoring and Reporting Policy (e.g., training, guidance, and templates)

GEF INTER-AGENCY EVALUATION WORKSHOP IN ROME

EIO was invited to the first inter-agency evaluation workshop of the GEF, "Strengthening Evaluation in the GEF Partnership: A Knowledge Sharing Event", jointly sponsored by the GEF Independent Evaluation Office (IEO) and the FAO-GEF Unit. It took place from 1 to 2 October 2024 in Rome, Italy.



EIO BRIEFING TO MEMBER STATES IN SEPTEMBER 2024

On 25 September 2024, EIO conducted a debriefing to Permanent Missions to provide Member States with a summary of results from recent evaluations and internal audit engagements, highlighting key findings, recommendations and management action plans, as well as ongoing and planned engagements under the EIO work plan for 2024–2025.



UN+ VIENNA EVALUATION NETWORK MEETINGS

The UN+ Vienna Evaluation Network met at the VIC on two occasions in 2024, in June and September. At the first meeting, held on 27 June, EIO delivered a presentation on the use of AI and other IT tools in evaluation. The focus of the second meeting, on 4 October, was the main takeaways from the European Evaluation Conference.



NEW EIO STRATEGY 2025-2029

EIO is currently preparing its new strategy 2025-2029, based on the assessment of the current EIO strategy 2020-2024, which was formally reviewed in 2023. The purpose of the EIO strategy remains that of a road map that ensures the alignment of EIO activities and adds value to UNIDO. The EIO strategy is the framework that guides the development of EIO biennial work plans.

PROJECT EVALUATION REPORTS

Highlight: Independent terminal evaluation of SwitchMed II (ID 180228) - Report and infographic.

SwitchMed II demonstrated strong alignment with global and national sustainable development agendas, promoting sustainable economic growth, innovation, and environmental protection, though deeper integration with national agendas and more flexible financial support for green entrepreneurs could enhance its relevance. While coherence with national policies was strong, coordination across project components and regional integration were less effective, limiting potential synergies. The project was generally efficient, though hindered by administrative delays and financial management challenges. Effectiveness was notable, with most objectives met, but financial sector engagement and coordination among partners lagged. Progress toward long-term impact was evident, though challenges remain in scaling effects and ensuring sustainability, particularly in entrepreneurship initiatives and national ownership. Despite these hurdles, the project has laid a foundation for continued positive environmental and economic outcomes, supported by strategic partnerships.

VALIDATION AND QUALITY ASSURANCE OF GEF PROJECT EVALUATIONS

In line with the Guidelines for Conducting Terminal Evaluations of Full-Size Projects, GEF Agencies can use either of two broad approaches — or a combination of the two — to ensure the independence of terminal evaluation. In the first approach, the evaluation unit of an Agency commissions, conducts, and/or manages a terminal evaluation. In the second approach, an Agency's operations unit manages, conducts, and/or commissions a terminal evaluation; the Agency evaluation unit then validates the evaluation and re-rates project performance. EIO's independent evaluation function quality assessed and validated below two self-evaluations:
