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

In order to assist UNIDO in the effort of planning, co-ordinating and determining priorities for technical assistance to member countries you are kindly invited to discuss any existing or future technical and economic problems connected with petrochemical developments in your country with Mr. Gerhard Bäger, Senior Interregional Adviser and to mention those problems in the space at the end of this memorandum by order of priority. As you know UNIDO renders assistance only at the request of governments.

For your guidance we are indicating the three main groups of possible assistance:

- (a) Planning and implementation
- (b) Assistance in solving problems connected with existing plants
- (c) Assistance towards the installation of small industrial plants for which UNIDO could provide the foreign currency component.

The assistance under (a) comprises amongst others: -

Market studies

Feasibility and pre-investment studies, including site evaluation and selection

Products selection

Promoting of financing and know-how

Corporate management

Organization, planning

Training

Tender specifications

Evaluation of tenders

Assistance in dealing with engineering contractors and other business partners

Drawing up contracts

Technical service to marketing, and sales promotion

Inspection techniques for materials of construction and equipment to be erected, with particular reference to non-destructive inspection

**Plant maintenance, organization of periodic maintenance
shut downs, prevention of fire and other hazards to industrial
operation.**

Industrial testing, state inspection, recuperation.

Standardization:

- a) purchasing and machinery specification for capital goods - proposed production facilities
- b) specification and testing methods for anticipated products.

The assistance offered is concerned with maintaining existing industries in full production. The definitive function involved in this step can be undertaken in the same firm or in "after-sales service" of an engineering company or equipment supplier - i.e., seeing that the services and goods furnished are performing as expected, or, if facing new conditions or difficulties that they are adapted to fulfil revised tasks. These operations, which can be classified as "trouble shooting", include:

**Operational adaptation to changes in raw materials,
supplies of utilities**

Changes in production mix

Overcoming operational or mechanical plant troubles

**Re-vamping of existing facilities to cope with
revised conditions**

Maintenance problems.

Section (c) requires the town or city to make available for **any** type of plant, whether or not it has improved technologies or not, the waste-effect plant, which can be used to reduce the amount of highly toxic materials that are produced by the plant. This will be done by having an outlet for the production of wastes that are not available.
