### AIDE-MÉMOIRE

#### I. Background

1. Subcontracting between large and small industrial establishments is a feature of a modern industrial economy. In the industrialized countries, a wide net of complementary relationships exists, in which large industrial corporations rely on smaller undertakings for the manufacture of parts, components and sub-assemblies, or certain manufacturing and building operations, which they incorporate into their own structures.

2. In the developing economies, even in those where large enterprises are established in industries lending themselves to subcontracting, there are hardly any such relationships between them and small-scale industries. As a rule, large industries in these countries are set up as self-contained units, manufacturing under their own roof a variety of items which, in industrial economies, would be produced by outside firms.

3. In spite of the wide practice of subcontracting in the industrial countries, very little is to be found in the economic literature on its role, organization, methods and results. The literature on the role of subcontracting in developing economies is practically non-existent.

4. In view of this, the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO) has included in its work programme a number of projects on subcontracting. These include the organization of meetings, both interregional and regional, and one-and-a-half-year studies. The purpose of these projects is to gather knowledge of this form of industrial organization, to advise and guide, for instance, by governments of developing countries, in this area, and to pave the way for technical co-operation projects for the promotion of subcontracting in these

countries. Some of these projects will be carried out in co-operation with other intergovernmental organizations, both within and outside the United Nations.

Subcontracting has also been one of the factors considered by the OECD Development Centre in the work it has undertaken in the field of industrial development. It was one of the important items included in the programme of the Symposium organised in September 1967 on "Assistance to small and medium-sized firms through collective actions" followed up by expert missions carried out in liaison with the International Association of Credit and Small and Medium-Sized Enterprises.

For this reason, the project is jointly sponsored by UNIDO and the Development Centre of OECD.

### II. Purpose of the Expert Group Meeting

The UNIDO/OECD project is to organise an Expert Group meeting on subcontracting between large and small industries. The purpose is to formulate, in the light of experience gained in selected industrial and developing countries, guidelines on the role which could be played by subcontracting in the industrialisation of the developing nations, and on the measures necessary for promoting and regulating it. It is expected, in particular, that the conclusions of the meeting will provide guidance for projects under technical co-operation programmes.

In view of the fact that subcontracting is mainly practised in the industrial countries, the meeting will bring together participants from both developed and developing countries in the expectation that a transfer of experience from the former to the latter will be achieved through the project.

### III. Time and venue

The Expert Group Meeting will be held at OECD Headquarters, in Paris, from 6 to 10 October, 1969.

### IV. Participants

The participants are expected to be persons involved in subcontracting operations on behalf either of large-scale industries, of trade organisations, of small business promotion centres or of governments. Participants will attend in their individual capacities as experts rather than as representatives of their Governments. They will be expected to attend the meeting for its entire duration.

The meeting will be attended also by officials and consultants of UNIDO and OMEC, of specialized agencies of the United Nations and of certain other international organisations.

Each country participant will be expected to submit a report containing a brief description of his country's experience in the field of subcontracting. Some of the participants will be requested to discuss also specific aspects of the subject. Each country report should not exceed 10 pages. It should be submitted to the organisation issuing the invitation - UNIDO or the Development Centre - by 20th August 1969 at the latest.

## V. Organization and Management

12. Plenary meetings will be held, one or twice a day, in accordance with the time schedule established by the Expert Group. Discussion will be of the "round-table" type.

13. Interpretation of any and all acts of the Bank, which act or acts may

to UNIDC and the International Centre of Child Development will provide the following research services:

- (a) Round trip allowance claimable, subject to deduction of dependent on who bore cost of travel, and back to the original point of departure.
  - (b) Subsistence allowance for six days.
  - (c) Terminal allowances.

15. The Organisation of Governments carrying the arrangements will be required to have the following objectives:

- (a) All who are sent in the name of the firm shall be entitled to travel abroad, including on visits of inspection, visits of inspection, and other business, such travel being paid for by the firm, except in case of depreciation in foreign currency;

(b) Salaries will be paid to persons engaged in the firm during the period of their services.

15. Neither UNITCO nor the Development Director of CATT will assume responsibility for the following information:

- (a) Travel or other costs incurred by the participant who might have been invited to participate;
  - (b) Costs incurred by participants who are not covered by their insurance, except accident insurance, and who do not receive a reduction in fare in connection with their participation;
  - (c) Compensation in the event of deviation, if the participant travels in connection with their participation;
  - (d) Loss of and/or damage to personal property of participants while attending the meeting.
