

JUTE CARPET BACKING

I. INTRODUCTION

. The Project

This project is for the manufacture of carpet backing cloth from jute to be exported mainly to U. S. A., Japan and Continental Europe.

. Foreign Contribution Required

The total investment required is roughly estimated at US\$ 11,836,000 of which a foreign exchange component of US \$ 4,437,000 will be needed in the form of loan to cover machinery and equipment. The proponent intends to form a new company with foreign equity participation of US \$ 2,101,000.

. Government Attitude

The project has been presented with the approval of the Government of Pakistan implying that the project has been given the green light for the implementation.

II. COMMERCIAL ASPECTS OF THE PROJECT

. Proposed Production Capacity

The proposed plant will have a capacity of 12,823 tons per annum.

. Local Production

Pakistan manufactures 120,000 to is of carpet backing cloth from jute during the month of February 1970 or an annual output of approximately 1.4 million tons.

. Proposed Price of Product

The price should conform with current international price standards since the product is export-oriented; taking this into consideration the proposed price of the product will be approximately \$590 per ton ex-factory.

III. PHYSICAL ASPECTS OF THE PROJECT

. Location

Rangoonia, near Chittagong, Pakistan (East)

. Land

77 acres of land has already been acquired for the project where factory building will be erected.

. Labour

Adequate skill of labour is abundantly available. Wages for skilled labour varies from \$74 to \$115 per month.

. Raw Materials

Rangoonia is surrounded by rich jute plantations, where raw jute of high quality is sufficiently available at an average cost of £337 per ton.

Infrastructure/Utilities

Infrastructure and utility facilities are well provided.

IV. ECONOMIC ASPECTS OF PROJECT

. Motivation of the Project

The jute industry in Pakistan is a prime foreign exchange earning industry as well as the cotton textile industry and its development is the immediate objective of the State. A new industrial undertaking located in East Pakistan and export-oriented is favoured by the State by way of a longer period of tax relief and export bonus system, both of which could make the business profitable.

Incentives

- a) There is no restriction on the remittance of current profit to the original country of investment.
- b) Foreign capital in approved industries may be repatriated to the extent of the original investment to the country of investment, in accordance with regulations in force at the time.
- c) Any part of profit accrued from foreign investment and ploughed back into an approved industrial project with government's approval, may also be treated as investment for repatriation purposes.
- d) Appreciation of any capital investment under (b) and (c) may also be treated for repatriation purposes. Repatriations will be subject to exchange control regulations in force from time to time.
- e) Import duty on capital machinery and their component parts have been fixed at 50% ad valorem, of which 30% is to be paid against custome clearance and the rest is payable by installments over two years.

- f) Depreciation if allowed at 25% on new plant and machinery.

 Extra allowance is also permissible at 50% and 100% of the normal rates for double and triple shift working.
- g) Six years tax holiday is granted to a new approved industrial undertaking in East Pakistan.


. Proposed Legal Structure
