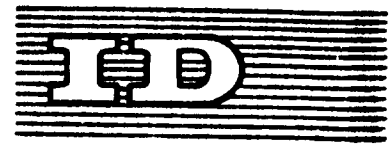

AIDE - MEMOIRE

PURPOSE

It has been recognized that the chemical processing equipment industry plays an important role in a world of growing industrialization. There is a desire to exchange views between developing countries and industrialized nations in chemical machinery, plants and equipment.

The purpose of this meeting is to discuss problems of the developing countries with regard to the overall project planning of chemical processing equipment production, the methodology, technology and design problems, followed by problems in manufacture, maintenance and operation, particularly with regard to safety, quality and continuity, and to identify the development in these fields.

DATE AND PLACE

Jointly organized by United Nations Industrial Development Organization and DECHEMA-Deutsche Gesellschaft für chemisches Apparatewesen e.V., the meeting will be held from 25 to 26 June 1970 in "Haus der Begegnung", Albertus-Magnus-Kollog in Königstein (Taunus) near Frankfurt/Main, Federal Republic of Germany.

PROGRAMME

The programme of the meeting is set out in the provisional agenda, number ID/WG.60/1, attached.

WORKING LANGUAGE

The official working language will be English. Simultaneous interpretation into French and Spanish will be available. Participants must be familiar with at least one of these languages.

PARTICIPANTS

A total of approximately 50 to 60 persons are expected to attend the meeting; they will be from both industrialized and developing countries, together with a number of observers from the industrial sector.

a) Participants from developing countries

The United Nations Industrial Development Organization and DECHETMA will be hosts to approximately 25 participants from developing countries. The participants will be directly concerned with the subject of this meeting and qualified in the technical field, in order to be able to participate in the proceedings.

These participants are expected to prepare a short outline of the actual state of and plans for the establishment and/or expansion of chemical processing machinery and plants in their countries, including possibilities of future manufacture. In addition, they are expected to participate actively in the discussions, and to assist in the preparation of the report of the meeting.

b) Experts (lecturers) from developed countries

DECHETMA and UNIDO will invite experts who are expected to prepare short papers on specific subjects. Each paper will be presented during the meeting, and lectures will be held, lasting approximately 30 minutes each. In addition, the experts will lead the discussions during the work sessions, and will assist in the preparation of the report of the meeting.

c) Observers

Observers are being invited from developing and developed countries to attend the meeting at their own expense. They are expected to assist in the discussions of the meeting.

DOCUMENTATION

For each item on the provisional agenda, a short paper will be prepared by the lecturers. It is intended that the summaries of the papers be distributed prior to the meeting to each participant.

REPORT

A final report will be published after the meeting.

FINANCIAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE ARRANGEMENTS

Financial arrangements for participants from developing countries, jointly selected by UNIDO and DECHETMA will be in accordance with the rules and regulations of the UNITED NATIONS, and will cover housing, board, and an additional allowance of US\$1.70 per day for the duration of the meeting.

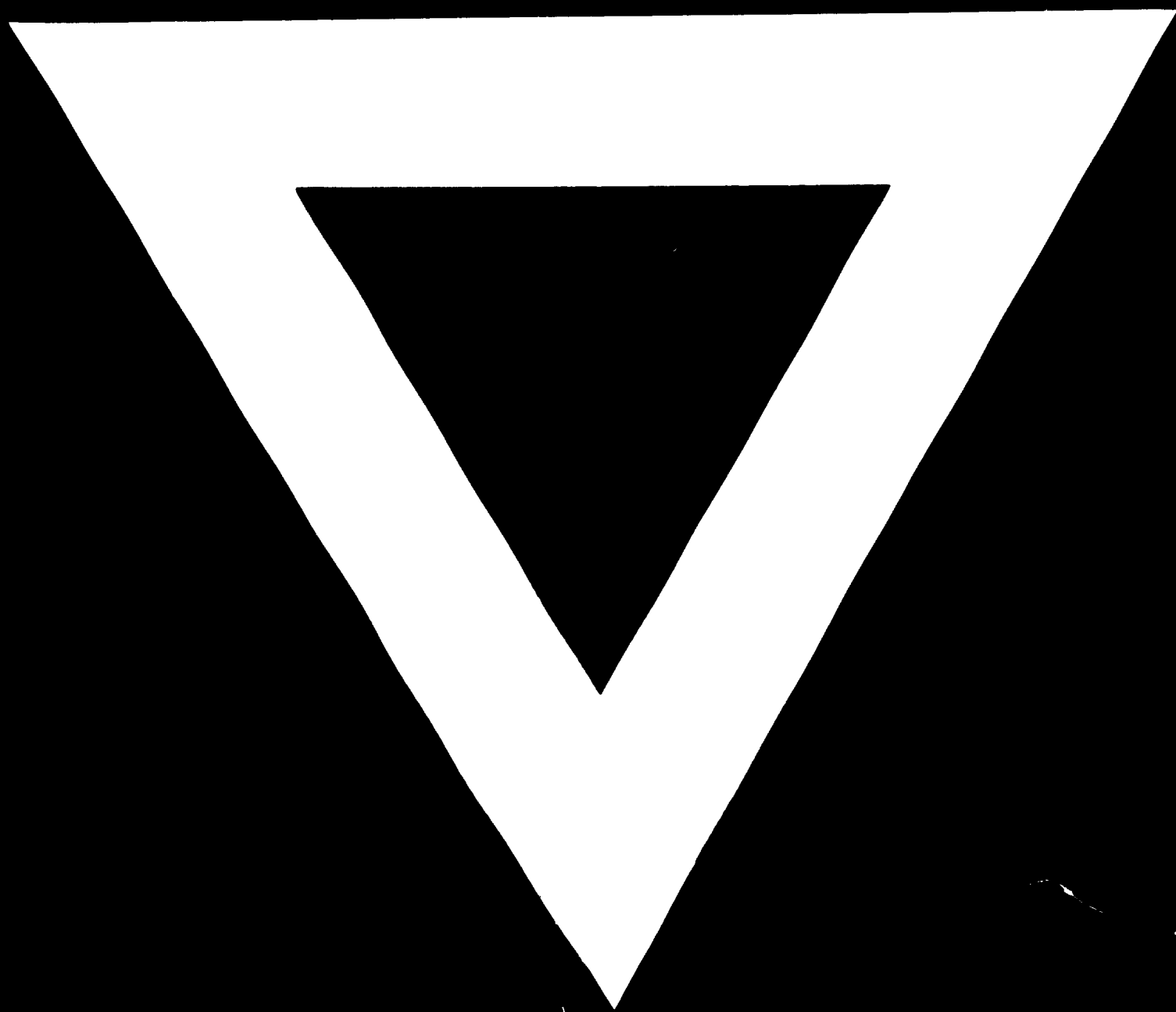
