

#### ANIMAL FODDER

#### I. INTRODUCTION

It is proposed to establish a plant for manufacturing animal fodder at the rate of 36,000 tons per year with an investment of US\$ 700,000.

The five year plan for development lays emphasis on the utilization of animal resources by encouraging related industries. It anticipates the establishment of 8 new factories for fodder production during the plan period (at present, only one factory for fodder products exists in Sudan).

The project will contribute to the economic development of the country by utilization of local raw material, enhancing local production of meat and dairy products and promoting cattle exports. It could therefore benefit from incentives to be granted by the government such as exemption from custom duties for machinery and equipment, exemption from profit tax for 5 years and guarantee for free capital repatriation in case of nationalization.

#### II. COMMERCIAL ASPECTS

The proposed production is geared to the domestic market, estimated at 50,000 tons in 1975 with a possibility of export.

Presently only one factory is producing animal fodder in Sudan. Its capacity is 10,000 tons per year.

The proposed price is US\$ 55 per ton.

#### III. PHYSICAL ASPECTS

The projected plant will produce on the basis of 24 hours/day operation/ 35,000 tons of fodder in the form of powder or pellets.

It will be located in the industrial area of Khartoum north, which disposes of efficient transport link with all parts of the country.

The main raw materials (vegetable oil cakes, ground nut shells and wheat bran) can be procured from nearby oil mills, decorticators and flour mills. Only molasses will have to be transported from the 100 miles distant Guneid sugar plant.

The foreign partner is expected to participate on the capital of the private company to be formed to furnish the know-how and to provide additional funds in the form of supplier's credit.


