CO-ORDINATION OF ACTIVITIES OF THE UNITED NATIONS SYSTEM OF ORGANIZATIONS IN THE FIELD OF INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT (ID/B/3 and Add.1-8)

The PRESIDENT noted that no delegation had maked to speak on agendation 5, and suggested that the question of the co-ordination of activities in the field of industrial development should be referred to the Sessional Committee set up to consider the draft rules of procedure of the Board, which had practically completed its work.

It was so decided.

Mr. MacLAREN (Canada) said he believed that the lack of speakers was due to the fact that the question of co-ordination had been dealt with to some extent in the context of the debate on the future programme and activities of UNIDO. That being so, the Poard might well take up another egenda item as soon as it had heard the statement of the Administrator of UNDP, who was scheduled to speak in the afternoon. The Sessional Committee should begin consideration of agenda items 5 and 6 immediately.

The PRESIDENT said that the representatives of some of the specialised agencies would be speaking after the Administrator of UNDP. The Board would then be able to proceed to the next agenda item. The Sessional Committee would not be able to begin its work until the regional groups had met.

The meeting rose at 10.55 a.m.
