QUESTIONS OF NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS

(a) Procedures for UNIDO relationships with international non-governmental organizations (ID/B/C.2/2, ID/B/31).

(b) Consideration of applications (ID/B/C.2/2, ID/B/32 and Add.1)

1. The PRESIDENT called on Mr. Petrov, Chairman of Committee II, to introduce the report of his Committee.

2. Mr. PETROV (Bulgaria), speaking as Chairman of Committee II, said that after several amendments had been put forward and incorporated into the text, unanimous agreement had been reached on the draft procedures contained in the Committee's report (ID/B/C.2/2). Pending the adoption of the new procedures, Committee II had felt that the consideration of applications was the prerogative of the Board itself.

3. The PRESIDENT proposed that the Board should approve the procedure proposed by Committee II in the annex to document ID/B/C.2/2.

4. It was so decided.

5. The PRESIDENT proposed that the ad hoc Committee to be set up under paragraph 2 of the procedure should consider the applications received and submit its proposals to the Board at its next meeting.

6. It was so decided.

OTHER BUSINESS

Relations with inter-governmental organizations (ID/B/C.2/2/Add.1, ID/B/33 and ID/B/33/Add.1).

7. Mr. PETROV (Bulgaria), speaking as Chairman of Committee II, said that the Committee had unanimously decided to recommend the following inter-governmental organizations for admission as observers in accordance with Rule 75 of the Rules of Procedure: (a) Standing Consultative Committee of the Maghreb; (b) International Agriculture and Food Industries Commissions; and (c) Common Afro-Malagasy Organization.

Additions to the lists of States in the annex to General Assembly resolution 2152 (XXI)

8. Mr. PEROV (Bulgaria), speaking as Chairman of Committee II, said that the Committee had unanimously decided to recommend that the Industrial Development Board should include the People's Republic of Southern Yemen and Mauritius, which had recently acquired independence, in Part A of the list of States annexed to General Assembly resolution 2152 (XXI).

9. The recommendations of Committee II were adopted.

10. Mr. SIBI (Ivory Coast) expressed appreciation, on behalf of the French-speaking African representatives, at the granting of consultative status to OCAM and emphasized that the African countries, which belonged to the least developed of the developing countries, placed great hopes in co-operation between UNIDO and OCAM.

The meeting rose at 10.25 a.m.
