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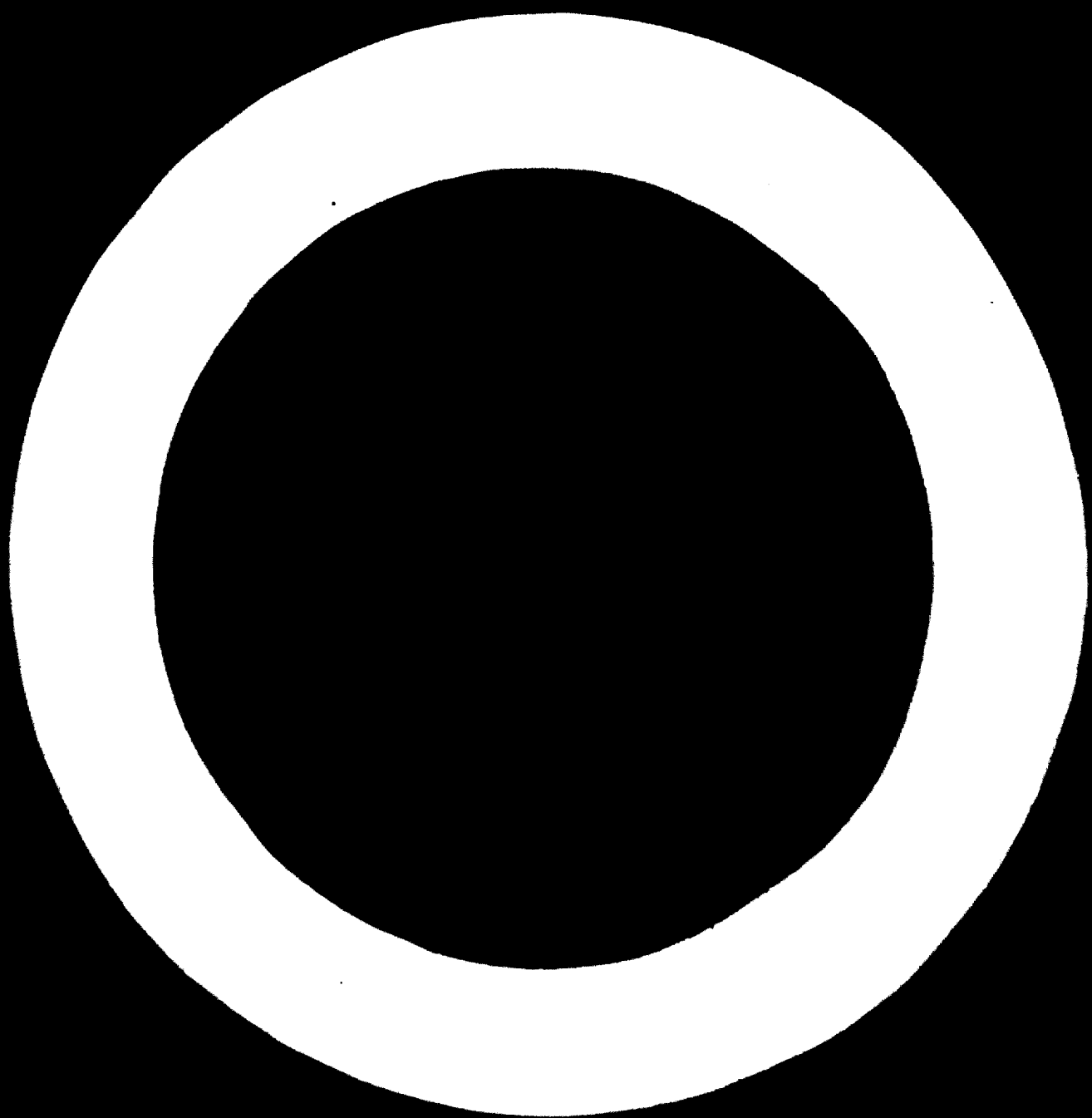
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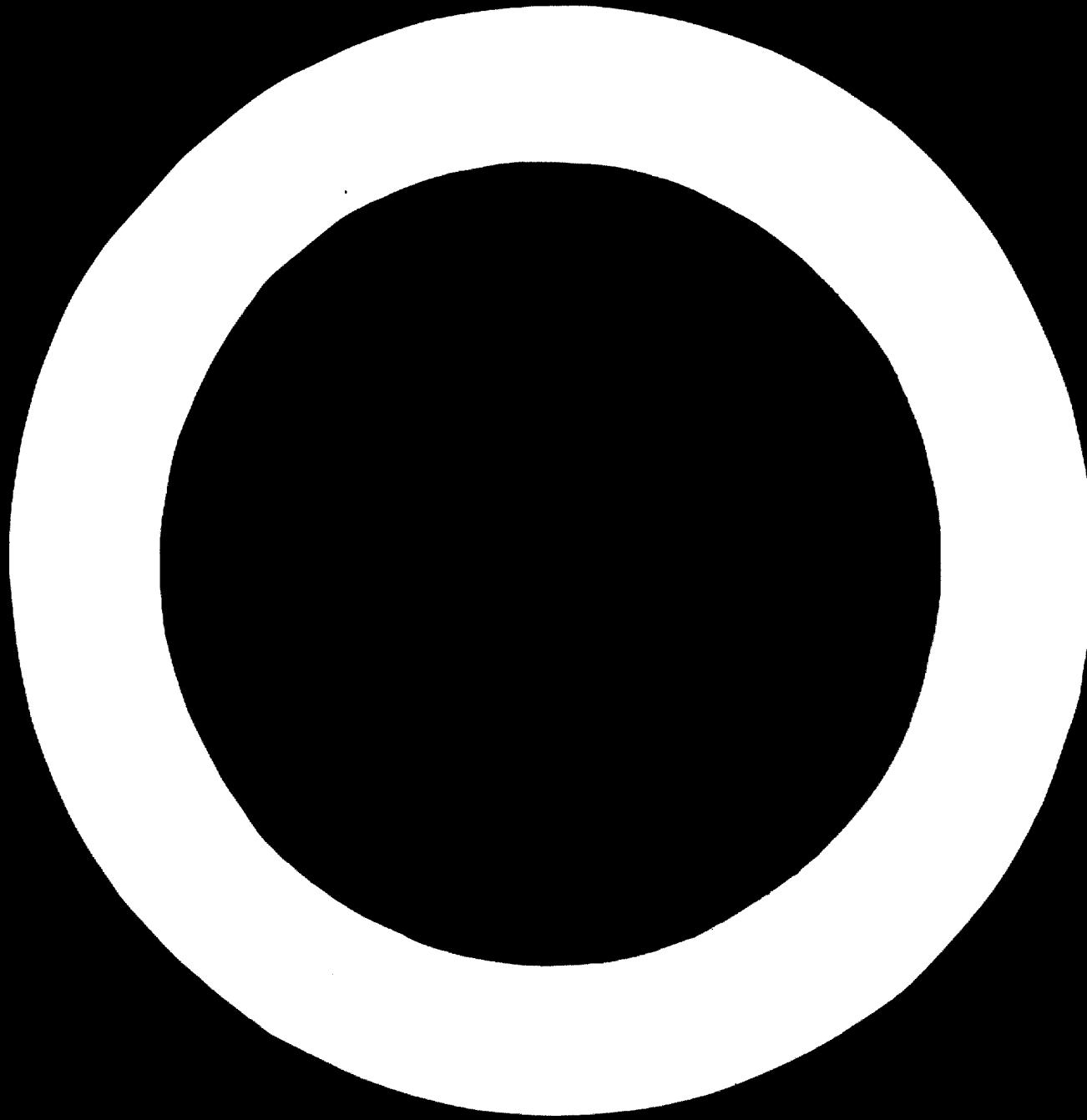

## PROPOSED AGENDA ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

### A. THE ENVIRONMENT FOR LEADERSHIP

- 1) Cultural and socio-economic conditions - past and present - which have influenced the administrative patterns in various countries: positive and negative factors
- 2) Desirability of selective adaptation of existing management techniques
- 3) Relationship to the work situation influenced by such factors as tradition, history, religion, cultural situation, and world environment
- 4) Pressing domestic economic and political problems
- 5) Influence of foreign factors
- 6) Scope for new initiatives in industrial administration

### B. THE IMPROVEMENT OF HUMAN POTENTIALS

- 1) Personal communications and relationships including visual communication
- 2) Development of leadership; forms of authority and participation; types of administrative skills needed
- 3) Motivation and understanding of subordinate objectives, motivation and personal disposition towards work
- 4) Achievement motivation
- 5) Goal formulation and systems for measurement of goal fulfillment
- 6) Organisational development (consideration of environmental change and conflicts between man and his position)


C. THE MANAGEMENT OF TECHNOLOGICAL INNOVATION

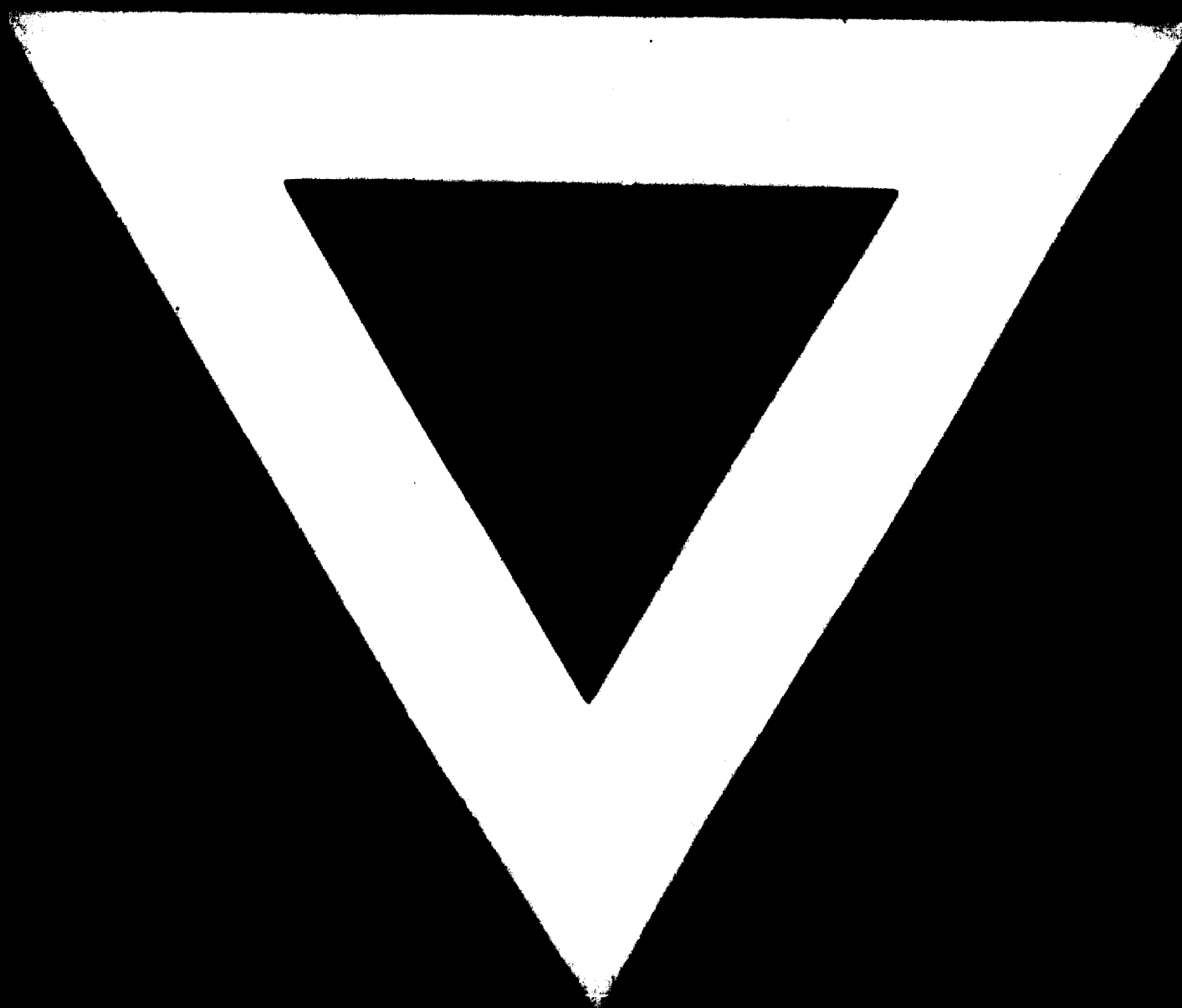
- 1) Uses and abuses of technology
