REPORT ON THE ESTABLISHMENT OF UNIDO HEADQUARTERS (ID/B/6 and Add.1 and Add.1/Corr.1, and Add.2 and Add.2/Corr.1) (continued)

Mr. RODRIGUEZ (Philippines) associated himself with previous speakers in expressing appreciation to the Austrian Government for its generous offer of buildings and facilities for UNIDO headquarters. His delegation was gratified at the results of the negotiations undertaken by the Executive Director with the Austrian Government, pursuant to General Assembly resolution 2212 (XXI). After consultations with the Austrian and other delegations, it had been decided to propose the following text for inclusion in the Board's report:

"The Board considered the report of the Executive Director of UNIDO on the establishment of UNIDO Headquarters contained in document ID/B/6, including its annexes, and endorsed with approval the arrangements therein."
The text was approved.

Mr. EOBLETER (Austria) thanked members of the Board for their kind words, and pledged his Government's unreserved support for UNIDO.

Mr. FERNANDINI (Peru) proposed that the President should draft a note to the delegation of Austria conveying the Board's thanks for the Austrian Government's generosity in offering Vienna as the site of UNIDO.

It was so agreed.

The meeting rose at 3.25 p.m.
