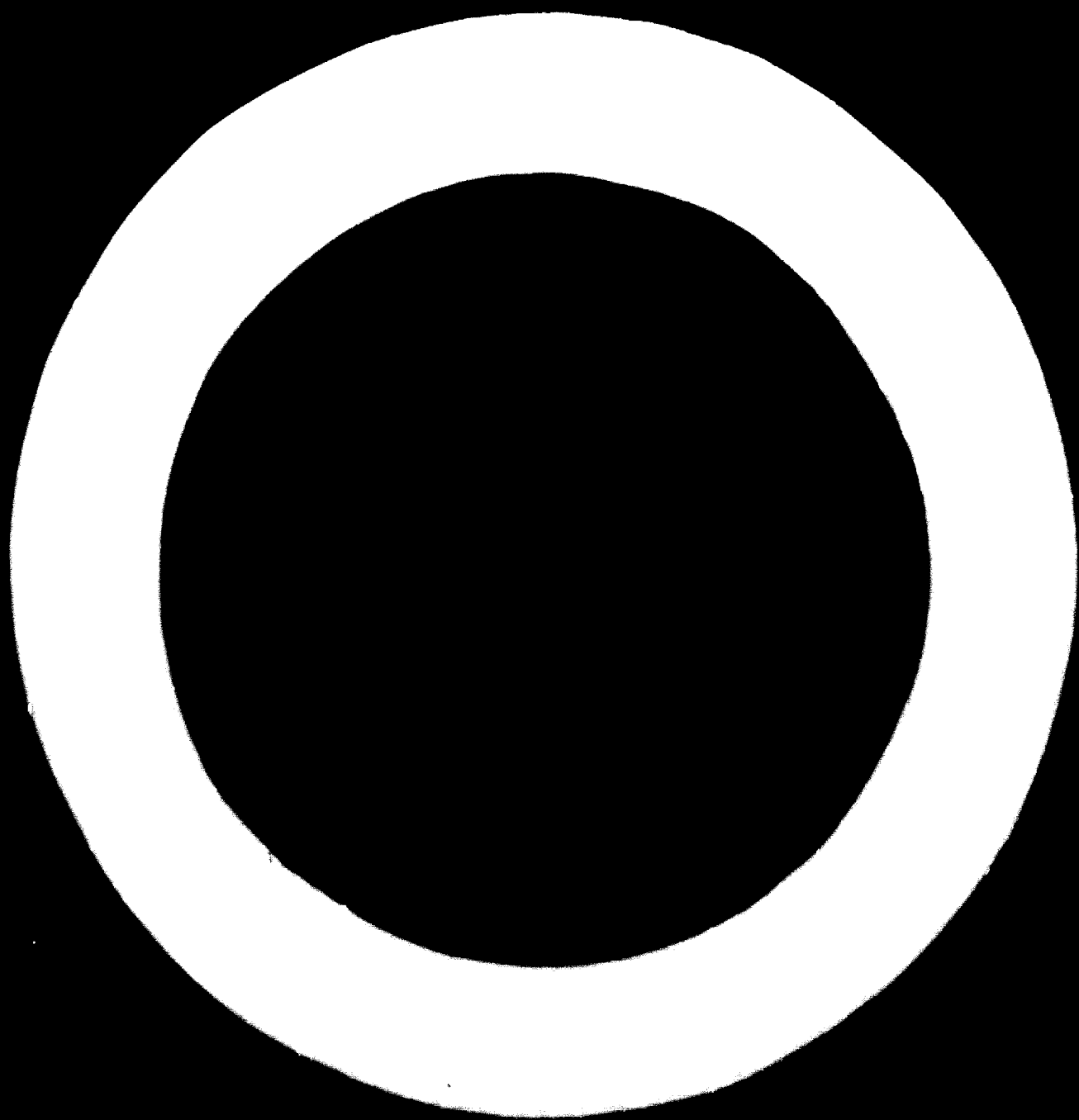

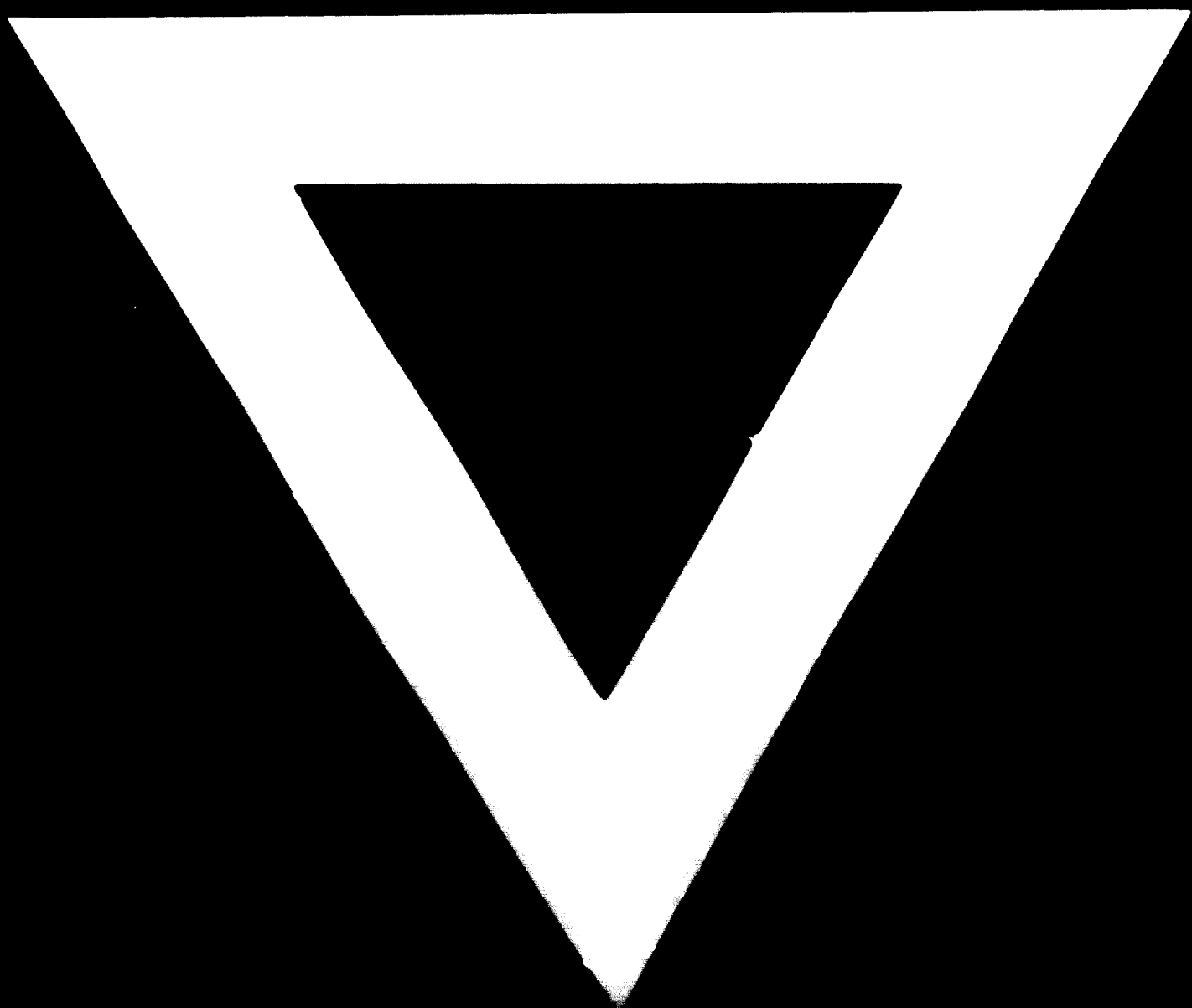
- 9.00 - 10.30 Free period for shopping, etc. (during which typing of final report will be completed)

NOTE

Each participant will be asked to explain in 20 minutes how his country's industrial development achievements depended on the strategy and policies followed since 1960 and the institutions developed. The remaining period is for questions and discussion.

A Rapporteur will be elected to prepare in draft each section of the Meeting's final report. Other participants and UNIDO staff will help them. Adherence to the timetable is essential to ensure that typed drafts are completed in time and translated into the three working languages (English, French and Spanish).

There will be a coffee break each morning at 10.00 or 10.30 and a lunch break at 12.00 or 12.30. A cafeteria is available in the Felderhaus.
