Introduction

This is a case study how a mini computer can be used with high efficiency in a particular industry - in this case a commercial application in the paper industry of Austria.

Hardware

IBM System 3, model 8; 32 K main memory with 10 megabyte disks (5 MB fix 5 MB removable 18000 lines per hr. printer
Diskette input station 3741
Monoprogramming - sequential processing

Software

The software has been written by their own programmers almost 100%. The number of programs is astonishingly high - some 380 Fortran and 450 RPG programs, with a reasonable level of sophistication, but not integrated.

Control of bank guarantees, letters of credit, credit notes, etc.

These are only the main categories of jobs run. Special reports - over a hundred - are run ad hoc in addition to special semi annual and annual closing jobs.

Personnel

The personnel to handle this volume of work at the central computer is:

- 2 programmers/system analysts (male)
- 2 operators (one male, one female)
- 2 data capture girls

Costs

Machine rentals costs run around (Including a remote unit in Styria)


Service

This is not only a very highly disciplined and well run center, it is also one with the best documentation. For the work this center produces, it is very low cost. It is a model operation from nearly every respect and deserves the close study of anyone who wants to employ a sequential, low cost mini computer correctly.

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
