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GEOGRAPHICAL DISTRIBUTION OF THE PROFESSIONAL STAFF OF UNIDO

Note by the Executive Director

1. Structurally and administratively, the UNIDO secretariat forms part of the United Nations Secretariat,^{1/} and therefore UNIDO does not appoint its own staff in the professional and higher categories. These staff members are appointed by the Secretary-General of the United Nations in accordance with the established United Nations procedures.

2. The geographical distribution situation in the Secretariat as a whole is reviewed annually in a report of the Secretary-General. A recent report entitled "Composition of the Secretariat" was submitted to the twenty-third session of the General Assembly^{2/}. Representatives particularly interested in the question are referred to this report and to the subsequent discussions of the Fifth Committee of the General Assembly.

3. As part of the United Nations Secretariat, UNIDO secretariat is subject to the over-all guidelines on geographical distribution which have been established by the General Assembly. The Secretary-General is also endeavouring to assure wide representative geographical distribution within the UNIDO secretariat. Throughout 1968 UNIDO, in conjunction with the Office of Personnel, has searched for qualified candidates from under-represented Member States in order to attain the widest possible geographical distribution within UNIDO. As of 31 December 1968, there were 167 staff members serving with UNIDO on appointments of one year or more, occupying posts subject to the principles of geographical distribution. These staff members represented 57 nationalities as outlined below.
