RESOLUTION ADOPTED BY THE INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT BOARD

Activities of the UNIDO Regional Advisers in 5 (II) the field of industrial development attached to the Economic Commissions of the United Nations and the United Nations Economic and Social Office in Beirut

The Industrial Development Board,

Recognising that full co-ordination is required between the work of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization and that of the regional economic commissions, and of the United Nations Economic and Social Office in Beirut, in the field of industrial development,

Taking into account that there are already regional advisers in the field of industrial development attached to the various regional commissions and to the United Nations Economic and Social Office in Beirut, financed through the Regular Programme of the United Nations in the field of industrial development (Part V, Section 14, of the United Nations budget and Document ID/B/26/Add. II/Rev.1),

Requests the Executive Director to continue his efforts of consulting with the Executive Secretaries of the regional economic commissions and the Director of the United Nations Economic and Social Office in Beirut with a view to maintaining closer co-operation which would utilize the regional industrial development advisers with a view to assuring harmonization of the activities of UNIDO and the regional economic commissions and the United Nations Economic and Social Office in Beirut in the field of industrial development;
