## The Industrial Loyolopment Board

Feoglling resolution 2298 (XXII) adopted by the Goneral issembly on 12 December 1967, and its own resulution : (I) of 4 May 1967 recomending the establishmont of a separate section in part $V$ of the United Nations budget to provido for the Programme of Technical iseistance in Industrial Dovelopment at an approprinte levcl comensurnte with the oxpandinf, requirements of the developing countries;

Xotine the Executive Director's report (ID/B/26/idd.II/Rov.I), in which he rocommonde a plannine lovel of us $\$ 1.5$ million for ection 14 of the United Mations dakegt (Repular Procrancue of Technical Asaistancu) in 1969 and almo etaten that this planning level ficure of $\$ 1.5$ mililion falls short by $\$ 750,000$ of the total cost of roquests roceivad from governments;

Haying regard to tho need to satisfy as far an poseible the requeste for aesietance made to UNIDO by certain povernments under the Regular Programee of Teohnioal issistance, in view of the great urgency with which the developing countries regard tho hastening of their industrial devolopmont;

1. Recomends the oum of US $\$ 1.5 \mathrm{million}$ as the planaint level of the Regular Progrmae of Teohnical inalatance for induatrial lovelopment in 1969 and 1970;
