Voluntary contribution to UNIDO by the Government of Italy to finance a project on in-plant training in management of repair and maintenance

Note by the Executive Director

1. At the twenty-third session of the General Assembly in 1968, His Excellency Mr. Giuseppe Ledici, Foreign Minister of Italy, announced a contribution by the Italiar Government to UNIDO of US3300,000 to be used to finance training activities in industry.

2. On 26 March 1970, the Executive Director of UNIDO was officially informed by the Italian Mission in Vienna that the Italian Government has made a contribution to UNIDO in the amount of Italian Lires 187,500,000 (US\$300,000) for the year 1969 and Italian Lires 187,500,000 (US\$300,000) for the year 1970 The amount of the contributions for 1969 and 1970, totalling Italian Lires 375,000,000 (US\$500,000); will be put at the disposal of UNIDO in 1970. This was confirmed by an exchange of letters between the Italian Mission in Vienna and the Executive Director of UNIDO.

3. As indicated in paragraph 98 of document ID/B/64 and paragraph 32 of document ID/B/64/Add.10, the contribution by the Italian Government is intended to finance a project of training management personnel in the industry of developing countries in methods and techniques of management of repair and maintenance. This training will be in the form of short-term courses, to be given under the programme, and in-plant training of such management personnel to familiarize them with modern methods of management of maintenance.
