



The working group for the use of plastics in agriculture is a new one of the ICP (Industrial Cooperative Program) near the F.A.O. in Rome.

Eleven important companies are members of the group.

The first meeting was in April in Paris.

Seven of these companies accepted to give money for immediate missions in Tunisia, Egypt, Senegal and Dahomey.

They are: Shell Montedison Petrofina  
(England) (Italy) (Belgium)

Ciba-Geigy Rhone-Profil Belast  
(Switzerland) (France) (U.S.A.)

and Charbonnage de France Chimie  
(France)

The first mission went to Tunisia and Egypt headed by the General Manager of the Wavia Company (Mr. Rowland) the big subsidiary of Shell making pipes in the beginning of June.

The second mission went to Senegal and Dahomey the first days of September, headed by a representative of Charbonnage de France Chimie.

During a meeting in September in Paris were approved the preliminary reports.

In October in Rome were taken the following decisions:

1. Do not make new missions before the achievement of some projects and concentrate our efforts to do a good and quick work.
2. Two specialists are in charge for the feasibility studies with Governments and U.N. organizations help.
3. Partners in the group are discussing for the repartition of responsibilities our efforts for each project (consortium).

And we hope to be able to arrive quickly to concrete proposals and so the job can be done.
