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秘书处的报告

1. 工业发展理事会第十三届会议决定，执行主任应编写协商制度进行工作所将遵循的议事规则草案，提交理事会一九七九年十一月的会议审议，必要时并交由工发组织第三次大会审议。

2. 工业发展理事会在第一届特别会议上审议了执行主任提交的题为“协商制度议事规则”的文件 ID/B/S.1/2。会议设立了一个自由参加的工作组来审议该文件的内容：关于协商制度的决议草案和关于协商制度的规则的附件。该工作组从一九七九年十一月十三日至十六日举行了会议。

3. 会议没有就关于协商制度的决议草案达成任何协议。

4. 文件 ID/B/S.1/2 的附件的各段落按照可能取得普遍协议的情况被分成“困难的”和“困难较小的”两类。自由参加的工作组决定设立一个由各地理区域代表组成的小型起草小组来审查被确定为困难较小的段落。该起草小组与自由参加的工作组同时开了两天会议，对某些被认为困难较小的段落所采取的共同措词达成临时协议；对于若干其他段落，三个主要的地理区域集团之中的二个达成了临时性的共同措词。自由参加的工作组则讨论了被认为是“困难的”段落；虽然交换意见是富有成果的，但是却没有就这些段落达成任何协议。

5. 根据自由参加的工作组的结论，理事会于一九七九年十一月十六日最后一次会议上通过了下列决议：

“工业发展理事会第一届特别会议审议了文件 ID/B/S.1/2 后，决定建议工发组织第三次大会请工发理事会在下一届常会上进一步审议和通过协商制度议事规则。”①

6. 为了便利第三次大会的工作，现将议事规则草案转载于附件一，并把自由参加的工作组所达成的各项临时协议和每一地理区域集团对议事规则的其他段落所提的各项修正案的非正式提要列为附件二。

导　　言

本文件提交给工业发展理事会，是根据理事会第十三届会议给予执行主任的下述任务，即起草“协商制度进行工作所将遵循的议事规则草案……提交理事会一九七九年十一月的会议审议，必要时并交由工发组织第三次大会审议；……”（A/34/16，第84(a)段）。

理事会将采取的行动

请理事会通过下列决议草案和附于其后的协商制度规则。

关于协商制度的决议草案

工业发展理事会

注意到，按照联大一九六六年十一月十七日第2152(XXI)号决议第二节第27段，联合国工业发展组织应为协调联合国系统在工业发展领域一切活动发挥中心作用，并负起审查和促进的责任；还注意到，按照联合国工业发展组织作为专门机构的章程第二条(f)项^①，在章程生效时设立的这个组织，应提供一个论坛并作为一个工具，以便发展中国家和工业化国家进行接触、协商以及应有关国家之请，进行谈判，以促进发展中国家的工业化；

回顾联大一九七四年五月一日关于《建立新的国际经济秩序的行动纲领》的第3202(S-VI)号决议，其中第三节规定，国际社会应作出一切努力来采取措施，以鼓励发展中国家的工业化，从而增加它们在世界工业生产总额中所占的份额；

铭记着联合国工业发展组织通过的《关于工业发展与合作的利马宣言和行动计划》^②，其中第28段规定，发展中国家在世界工业生产总额中所占的份额，到二〇〇〇年应至少增加到百分之二十五，同时要尽一切努力确保这样实现的工业增长尽可能平均地分布在发展中国家之间。

又铭记着《利马宣言和行动计划》第63至65段建议，新的工业活动分布必须使一切发展中国家都能够进行工业化，并且在联合国系统内获得一个有效的工具，以实现它们的愿望；工业化的进行应能促进国际社会各国全球性的和谐发展；工发组织应在执行《利马宣言和行动计划》方面发挥中心作用，发起和协调联合国系统内的活动，以完成这些文件里所载属于工发组织职权范围内的目标。为了达到上述目标，《利马宣言和行动计划》第66段建议，工发组织应该使它的活动包括一个在全球、区域和部门各级进行持续协商的制度；

回顾联大在一九七五年九月十六日通过关于《发展和国际经济合作》的第3362(S-VII)号决议，其中第四章第3和4段规定，应在联合国工业发展组织及其它适当的国际机构中，根据《利马宣言和行动计划》的规定，建立一种全球、区域、区域间及部门各级的协商制度，并请工发组织执行主任立即采取行动，确保该组织作好准备工作，作为工业领域中协定的协商和谈判的论坛。此外，请工业发展理事会早日草拟该制度进行工作所将遵循的议事规则。

铭记着：

- (a) 工业发展理事会第十届会议^③要求工发组织执行主任安排试验性质的部门协商，但须顾及《利马宣言和行动计划》所指出的优先部门；
- (b) 工业发展理事会第十二届会议^④决定，工发组织秘书处应为工业人力培训问题和发展中国家工业发展资金筹措问题的全球协商会议，作出初步安排；
- (c) 工业发展理事会第十三届会议^⑤决定，应召开区域和区域间协商会议，但须先经理事会审议批准；

回顾工业发展理事会第十三员会议审查了协商制度在试验阶段所起的作用，认识到协商制度已经成为工发组织的一个重要和既定的活动，并作出结论说，应当把它当作本组织的经常活动予以继续和加强，以便尽量造福发展中国家^⑥；

进一步回顾工业发展理事会第十三届会议还要求执行主任起草协商制度进行工作所将遵循的议事规则草案，提交给一九七九年十一月作为联合国工业发展组织第三次大会政府间筹备委员会的工业发展理事会第一届特别会议审议⑦；

考虑了执行主任拟订的协商制度议事规则草案⑧；

决定把协商制度当作工发组织的永久性活动予以继续，并通过附在后面的议事规则，以便对其工作进行管理。

附 件

协商制度的规则

一、协商制度

1. 协商制度应为联合国工业发展组织（工发组织）借以使其成为一个论坛的工具，这一论坛是为了发展中国家和发达国家进行接触、协商以及应有关国家之请，进行谈判，以促进发展中国家的工业化。

2. 协商制度应提供一个持续进行关于国际工业合作的对话的构架，包括现有的合作形式以及在必要时对那些形式所作出的改进。

3. 按该制度进行的协商会议应成为一个论坛，用以讨论如何通过协同行动来增加发展中国家在世界工业生产总额中所占份额的方法和途径，并对此种方法和途径达成一致意见，其中包括重新部署发达国家现有的一些生产能力并在发展中国家创建一些新的工业设施。

4. 在有关国家请求之下，协商会议也可以作为发达国家同发展中国家之间以及发展中国家自身之间就工业领域里各项协定进行谈判的一种论坛。

5. 协商会议应对正在审议中的各项问题寻求采取着重于行动的措施。为此，应从政策、经济、社会和技术等角度，持续审议与发展中国家的工业化有关的各种问题。

6. 协商会议可以涉及发展中国家相互间，或发达国家同发展中国家之间的合作问题，以及发达国家之间的合作问题，只要这种合作会影响发展中国家的工业化。

7. 鉴于所要讨论的问题的复杂性和多样性，以及这些问题之间的相互关系，协商制度应分成全球、区域、区域间和部门等四级，并应视情况和按第8至11段分别所作说明予以采用。

8. 在全球一级的协商会议可以特别包括：

- (a) 与促进和加速发展中国家的工业化有关的问题；
- (b) 若干工业部门所共有的议题。

全球性协商会议应根据当前的国际工业合作惯例，拟订各种建议以促进发达国家和

发展中国家之间以及发展中国家自身之间在工业领域里进行更密切的协作，同时考虑到所涉及的各种利害关系和发展中国家加速工业化的需要。

9. 在区域一级的协商会议可以特别包括：

- (a) 与该区域工业发展有关的问题；
- (b) 与该区域有关的任何议题或工业部门，目的是使区域内所有国家能采取协同行动；
- (c) 部门性或全球性协商会议曾经讨论过的任何议题或工业部门，以便促进在区域一级执行在那些会议上提出的任何建议。

10. 区域间一级的协商可以特别包括任何两个或两个以上的区域间就任何议题或工业部门当前或今后所进行的工业合作。

11. 部门一级的协商会议可以特别包括：

- (a) 考虑到部门内不断变化的各种型式，同时顾及影响其未来发展的主要趋向；
- (b) 确定发展中国家在该部门可能占有的份额和考虑可能用以达到这个份额的方法和途径；
- (c) 拟订在国家、区域、区域间和世界各级采取行动的各项建议。

12. 应当利用协商制度来监测世界工业的各种趋向，这样或许可以使所预测到的有关发展中国家工业化过程的一些问题免于出现，同时也可着手处理那些已经发现的问题。为此目的，工发组织秘书处应编写、增订和持续地审查关于各项议题和工业部门的研究报告。

13. 由于协商制度的目的是准许所有有关各方参与确定与发展中国家工业化有关的那些问题，并寻求解决这些问题的办法，所以协商活动必须与工发组织的其他活动特别与下列各项活动密切协调：

- (a) 应尽可能根据秘书处在工业研究、技术合作方案、可供选择的技术来源和投资促进等方面的活动，提出所面向的各个问题并制订解决这些问题的办法；
- (b) 上述各种活动必须考虑协商会议作出的结论和建议，以便指导工发组织拟订的方案。

14. 由于工发组织在联合国系统内工业发展领域里所担负的中心协调任务，工发组织执行主任（执行主任）应采取必要步骤来促成该系统内的各组织、机关和方案，在它们各自的职权范围内积极参与协商制度并作出贡献。

二、协商制度的执行

A. 协商方案

15. 工业发展理事会（理事会）应确定将要举行的各次协商会议的议题和有关的工业部门以及级别。理事会每两年应就相当于财政期的下一个两年期的协商方案作出决定。

B. 筹备工作

16. 应充分筹备每次协商会议，并根据以下各点确定所要审议的各项议题：

- (a) 工发组织秘书处所编写的研究报告，以及在适当情况下由其他联合国机关或国际组织所编写的研究报告；
- (b) 由执行主任在适当顾及地域分配原则之下选定的专家对上述研究报告和其他文件个别地或在适当的会议上所进行的讨论；
- (c) 与各有关行业的代表所进行的非正式的联系。

17. 每次协商会议的文件，应提前分发给上述已接受邀请的参与者——通常是在开幕之前两个月——俾得以事先予以充分考虑。

C. 参加

18. 一切协商应在国家之间进行。

- (a) 全球性和部门性协商会议的正式参加，应对经修正的联大第2152(XXI)号决议附件所列的一切国家开放；
- (b) 区域性和区域间协商会议的正式参加，应对上述决议所列而位于该有关区域或各有关区域的一切国家（各区域委员会所规定的或在必要时由理事会确定的国家）开放；也可以对这些国家一致同意接纳的其他国家开放；上述决议所列而并非位于在该有关区域或各有关区域的任何其他国家，也可参加此类协商会议^②。

19. 任何参加协商会议的国家可以由政府官员以及其政府认为适当的工业界、劳工界、消费者团体和其他团体所派的代表出席会议。一份载列代表团团长及成员的名单，应通过官方途径送交给执行主任；在此以后，所指派的代表团团长得通知执行主任代表团其他成员的姓名，以及通知指派一名或一名以上可代行其职务的副团长。

20. 国际政府间组织和非政府组织凡在某一协商会议将要考虑的若干领域中具有权限者，得由执行主任邀请参加该次协商会议。^(a)

D. 财政安排

21. 协商会议的费用，凡属联大第2152(XXI)号决议第二节第20(a)和21段所意指的范围，应视为工发组织的行政费用，但以联大第31/140号决议第5段所规定的此项费用未由一个国家或任何其他来源承担为限。

22. 在通常情况下，协商会议的每个参与国都应自行负担其代表团的费用。

E. 报告和后续行动

23. 每次协商会议都应编制一份报告，其中应载有参与国协商一致议定的各项结论和建议，以及在讨论期间所发表的其他重要意见的摘要。这些报告应提交给理事会审议。

24. 理事会审议了某一协商会议的报告后，得：

- (a) 认可报告中的议定的结论和建议；
- (b) 决定工发组织将要采取的行动；
- (c) 在报告中的各项结论和建议以及理事会的意见和提议需要采取政府和政府间的行动的情况下，决定促请各国政府、国际政府间和非政府间组织，以及特别是联大、经济及社会理事会和其他联合国的主管机关予以注意。
- (d) 当报告在理事会认为重要的问题上反映出不同意见时，请执行主任作出安排，在以后举行的协商会议上对这些问题进一步加以审议。

F. 联合主办

25. 工发组织可以与联合国其他机关或与政府间组织联合主办某一次具体的协商会议；在这种情况下，执行主任应与其他各有关行政负责人合作，就协商会议的筹备和举办方面的任务分配，作出决定。

三、协商会议上事务的处理

A. 日期、地点和会期

26. 执行主任应确定每一次协商会议的日期、地点和会期，同时应顾及理事会对协商会议的方案所作的决定和筹备安排的进展情况。

B. 议程

27. 执行主任应根据筹备安排的情况，拟订每次协商会议的议程，并至少在该会议开幕以前三个月，将议程通知所邀请的所有国家和组织。

28. 除非经过正式参与国的一致同意，协商会议不得更改议程。

C. 主席团成员

29. 每次协商会议应选举主席一人和副主席数人，旨在确保各参与区域的代表性。上述成员组成主席团。

30. 如主席因故不能出席某次协商会议或部分会议时，他应指定副主席一人代行主席职务。副主席代理主席时，其权力和职责与主席相同。

31. 主席应宣布每届会议的开幕和闭幕、主持讨论、确保对本规则的遵守、准许发言、提出程序性和实质性的提议、把问题付诸表决并宣布决定，以及履行本规则或该次协商会议所赋予他的其他职责。

D. 工作组

32. 协商会议可设立工作组，在情况适合时包括正式参与国和其他参与国的代表，以便审议具体项目或起草结论和建议。

E. 公开和非公开会议

33. 协商会议包括工作组会议，除非有关机构另有决定，均应公开举行。

F. 秘书处

34. 执行主任或其代表应提供协商会议所需的工作人员并给予指导。

35. 工发组织秘书处应负责编写和分发文件并组织讨论；应协助主席执行其任务，并应履行本规则所赋予的或协商会议可能要求它担负的其他职责。

36. 执行主任或其代表可作口头或书面声明。

G. 语文和记录

37. 将以协商会议的任何正式参与国所实际需要的理事会正式语文^(b)提供口译。发言人如作出安排将发言口译成协商会议所用的语文之一，则可以使用理事会正式语文以外的一种语文。

38. 协商会议的文件应以会议的任何正式参与国所实际需要的理事会工作语文^(c)来编制。应参与国的要求并在可行范围内，文件也可以理事会的其他正式语文印发。

39. 协商会议的报告应以理事会正式语文编写。

40. 将不准备编制逐字记录或简要记录。协商会议的录音记录及在适当情况下，工作组的录音记录，应由工发组织秘书处保存。

H. 发言权

41. 任何代表事先未得主席允许，不得在协商会议发言。除下述第四十六条规则所规定者外，主席应按代表请求发言的先后次序请他们发言。如发言人的言论与所讨论的议题无关，主席可敦促他遵守议事规则。

42. 协商会议可限制每一发言人的发言时间和对任何问题的发言次数。

I. 实质性提案

43. 任何参与国得提出实质性提案及其修正案，但仅在某一正式参与国代表团团长的要求之下，方可对此作出决定。

44. 此种提案及修正案通常应以书面提出并由秘书处分发。在通常情况下，在分发的次日之前，这些提案和修正案不得在协商会议上加以讨论。但主席仍可准许对未予分发或于当日分发的提案和修正案进行讨论和审议。

J. 程序性动议

45. 程序性动议，包括要求暂停会议或休会、暂停辩论或结束辩论所讨论项目的动议，得由任何正式参与国代表团团长于任何时间口头提出。这些动议应优先

于实质性提案，并只应在主席作出裁决以前所规定的限制内进行辩论。

K. 程序问题

46. 任何参与国得在任何时间提出程序问题，主席应立即按本规则对该程序问题作出裁决。任一正式参与国代表团团长可对主席的裁决提出异议；按照下述第四十八条的规定，除非立即作出的决定赞同此项异议，主席的裁决仍应有效。

L. 作出决定

47. 对于协商会议的结论和建议，应以协商一致意见作出决定。在所有参与区域的代表和大多数正式参与国的代表出席会议的情况下，方可作出决定。

48. 对于其他问题，通常也应以协商一致意见来作出决定。但若不能取得协商一致意见，任何正式参与国代表团团长可要求进行表决，对该问题得由大多数出席并参加表决的正式参与国代表团团长作出决定。

49. 本规则各条内“协商一致意见”一词的意义系指决定的达成没有遭到任何一个正式参与国代表团团长的公开反对。

50. 可能使工发组织或另一国际组织支付费用的任何决定，必须考虑到工发组织秘书处提出的所涉及的财政问题的报告。

M. 报告

51. 上述第二十三条所要求的报告草稿应由秘书处编写，并由主席以主席团的名义提交协商会议认可。

N. 其他程序问题

52. 未经本规则规定的任何程序问题，应按理事会议事规则予以确定，但以理事会议事规则不违背本规则为限。

四. 修正

53. 本规则可由理事会加以修正。

DRAFT RESOLUTION ON THE SYSTEM OF CONSULTATIONS**The Industrial Development Board,**

Noting that, according to paragraph 27 of section II of General Assembly resolution 2152 (XXI), of 17 November 1966, the United Nations Industrial Development Organization is to play the central role in and be responsible for reviewing and promoting the coordination of all activities of the United Nations system in the field of industrial development and that, according to subparagraph (f) of Article 2 of the Constitution of the United Nations Industrial Development Organisation as a Specialized Agency,^{1/} the Organization to be established on the entry into force of that Constitution is to provide a forum and act as an instrument to serve the developing countries and the industrialized countries in their contacts, consultations and, at the request of the countries concerned, negotiations directed towards the industrialization of the developing countries;

Recalling section III of General Assembly resolution 3202 (S-VI), of 1 May 1974, on the programme of Action on the Establishment of a New International Economic Order, according to which every effort should be made by the international community to take measures to encourage the industrialization of the developing countries with a view to increasing their share in world industrial production;

Bearing in mind paragraph 28 of the Lima Declaration and Plan of Action on Industrial Development and Co-operation, adopted by the Second General Conference of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization,^{2/} according to which the share of developing countries should be increased to at least 25 per cent of total world industrial production by the year 2000, while making every endeavour to ensure that the industrial growth so achieved is distributed among developing countries as evenly as possible;

Further bearing in mind that paragraphs 63 to 65 of the Lima Declaration and Plan of Action recommended that the new distribution of industrial activities must make it possible for all developing countries to industrialize and to obtain an efficient instrument within the United Nations system to fulfil their aspirations, that industrialization must be pursued in such a way as to promote the global harmonious development of the countries of the international community, that the United Nations Industrial Development Organization should play a central role in the implementation of the Lima Declaration and Plan of Action by initiating and co-ordinating activities within the United Nations system aimed at achieving the objectives contained therein as far as they fall within the competence of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization, and that to attain these objectives, paragraph 66 of the Lima Declaration and Plan of Action recommended that the United Nations Industrial Development Organisation should include among its activities a system of continuing consultations at global, regional and sectoral levels;

Recalling paragraphs 3 and 4 of section IV of General Assembly resolution 3362 (S-VII), of 16 September 1975, on Development and International Economic Co-operation, according to which a system of consultations, as provided for by the Lima Declaration and Plan of Action, should be established at the global, regional, interregional and sectoral levels within the United Nations Industrial Development Organization and within other appropriate international bodies, requested the Executive Director of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization to take immediate action to ensure the readiness of the Organisation to serve as a forum for consultations and negotiations of agreements in the field of industry, and invited the Industrial Development Board to draw up, at an early date, the rules of procedure according to which this system would operate;

Bearing in mind that:

- (a) at its tenth session^{3/} the Industrial Development Board requested the Executive Director of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization to organize sectoral consultations on an experimental basis, taking into account the priority sectors indicated in the Lima Declaration and Plan of Action;
- (b) at its twelfth session^{4/} the Industrial Development Board decided that the Secretariat of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization should make preliminary arrangements for global consultations on the training of industrial manpower and the financing of industrial development in developing countries; and
- (c) at its thirteenth session^{5/} the Industrial Development Board decided that regional and interregional consultations should be convened, subject to its considerations;

Recalling that at its thirteenth session the Industrial Development Board reviewed the functioning of the System of Consultations during its experimental phase, recognized that the System had become an important and established activity of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization and concluded that it should be continue as an ongoing activity of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization and strengthened so as to provide the greatest possible benefit to the developing countries; 6/

ANNEX
RULES FOR THE SYSTEM OF CONSULTATIONSI. The System of Consultations

1. The System of Consultations shall be the instrument through which the United Nations Industrial Development Organisation (UNIDO) is to serve as a forum for developing and developed countries in their contacts, consultations and, at the request of the countries concerned, negotiations directed towards the industrialisation of developing countries.

2. The System shall provide a framework for a continuing dialogue on international industrial co-operation, covering both the present forms of such co-operation as well as required improvements therein whenever and wherever necessary.

3. Consultations within the System shall be a forum for discussing and reaching consensus on ways and means to increase, through concerted action, the share of developing countries in world industrial production, including the redeployment of certain productive capacities existing in developed countries and the creation of new industrial facilities in developing countries.


