Remediation Technologies Application for Heavily Polluted Sites in CEE countries

Bratislava, 24 - 26 June 2002

Background

One of the most urgent problems to be faced at a global level is the decontamination of soil and waters due to domestic and industrial activities. Large polluted areas besides having lost their eco-functionality, often represent a serious risk for human health.

The policy for the restoration of natural resources is thus a priority in many countries, both industrialized and with economies in transition, and there is the need to allocate extensive financial as well as scientific and technical resources for environmental protection and recovery. Environmental situation in each country is specific by type, distribution and extent of contamination and a proper integrated environmental strategy together with the availability of sound and suitable decontamination technologies is one of the priorities for the years to come.

On the basis of the above considerations ICS, in cooperation with the Slovak Environmental Agency, has organized a workshop on "Remediation Technologies Application for Heavily Polluted Sites in CEE Countries", which represents one of further steps of the ICS programme.

Objectives

- To survey strategies, criteria, methodologies and tools for the risk based management of contaminated sites as well as tools (DSTs) for the management of environmental recovery activities.
- To survey environmental regulatory framework legislative tools for environmental recovery initiatives and existing information systems on pollution sources and contaminated sites.
- To survey the state of art in CEE transition-economy countries and identify key common problems.
- To define the ICS-UNIDO follow-up actions relevant to the topic in selected transitioneconomy countries as well as the actions to be taken for the establishment of the ICS CEE Forum on Remediation.

Organization

The workshop was organized by the Slovak Environmental Agency in cooperation with the Ministry of the Environment of the Slovak Republic in the Institute of Education and Services in Bratislava between 24 and 26 June 2002.

Funding

The ICS-UNIDO approved contribution was US\$ 20,000.

The amount received on 12 June 2002 was US\$ 16,000.

The hosting country contributed 2,000 US\$ for the administrative support of the workshop, rent of premises and equipment.

The actual expenses covered by UNIDO (US\$ 13,919) were lower than the foreseen sum especially in the item *Travel of invited lecturers and participants*, mainly because there were more lecturers from neighbouring countries than the original assumption was and their travel expenses were lower and also because some foreign lecturers found other financial sources to cover their air tickets than our budget. No reduction of the total number of participants occurred, actually the number of lecturers and participants were even higher than the original planned.

The leftover of the UNIDO contribution (US\$ 2,081) will be reimbursed to UNIDO.

A summary of the final budget is given in *Appendix 1*.

As can be seen from the table, the participants' feedback was very positive and the overall score of the top two grades (excellent + very good) was 71%. The only insufficiency was connected with very hot weather and lecture room without air conditioning.

Proposal for Possible Follow-up Activities

The workshop led to preliminary proposals of follow-up activities, mainly focused on the development of CEE Forum on Remediation, which is also one of the recommendations from the International Forum on Strategies and Priorities for Environmental Industries, which was held in Bratislava on 12-14 June 2002. The main objective of the Forum is to support CEE countries in tackling problems related to heavily polluted sites with special regard to:

- > Information management
- > Knowledge transfer, exchange of data and expertise with regard to remediation technologies and their application
- > Support the development and implementation of decision support tools in risk based management of contaminated sites and in remediation technology evaluation and selection

- > Tight cooperation with other international initiatives / networks
- > Identification and possible promotion of pilot projects devoted to urgent remediation problems

Next actions to be undertaken for the CEE Forum on Remediation:

1st Phase:

- □ Creation of a permanent CEE forum Committee, creation and maintenance of the CEE Forum website, secretary, etc.
- Preparation of the draft project proposal of CEE Forum to be submitted to the 6th Framework Programme

2nd Phase:

- Creation of the Task Groups of the CEE Forum, identification of partners, leading institutions/persons for each Task Group
- Preparation of the action plan and full implementation of the CEE Forum
