- ADOPTION OF THE REPORT OF THE THIRD SESSION (ID/B/B.44/Add.4, Adds. 7-10 and Add.14; ID/B/L.66) (continued)
 - The PRESIDENT invited the Board to continue its consideration of the draft report, taking up chapter III: Activities of UNIDO (ID/B/L.44/Add.4), together with the emendments proposed by Bulgaria, Cuba, Czechoslovakia, Poland and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (ID/B/L.63). Since chapter III consisted of the report of the Working Group on Programme and Co-ordination as revised and adopted by the Board, he would submit only those paragraphs which contained new material or which were the subject of amendments.

- 5. Mr. SHATSKY (Union of Soviet Socialist Republics) introduced the amendment to paragraph 118 proposed by the five socialist countries (ID/B/L.68, Group 6).
- 6. Mr. ROBERTS (Canada) suggested that the word "many" should be inserted before the words "other delegations" in the final sentence of paragraph 118.
- 7. After some discussion, the FRESIDENT suggested that the word "several" should be inserted at the point indicated by the representative of Canada.
- 8. It was so agreed.

Paragraph 250

36. Mr. SHATSKY (Union of Seviet Socialist Republics) introduced the amendment to paragraph 050 proposed by the five cocialist countries (ID/B/L.68).

- Mr. BOYCE (United Kingdom) suggested that the five-Power amendment should be medified be read as follows: "In connexion with the Executive Director's statement that the main question was whether 'the developed countries saw the developing countries as partners and therefore would develop a policy of helping the developing countries to industrialize' or 'might try to contain ... ". If that sub-amendment was approved, it would be necessary to substitute the words "the latter" for the word "this" after the words "one delegation stated that".
- Mr. VAVASSEUR (France) considered that the amendment proposed by the five socialist countries, even as modified by the United Kingdom, tended to distort what the Executive Director had actually said. He therefore wished to suggest that the following amendment should be added to paragraph 250: "It appeared to other delegations that the Executive Director had limited himself in his statement to presenting alternatives".
- 39. After a short discussion, the RESIDENT suggested that the five-Power amendments, with the further amendments submitted by the delegations of the United Kingdom and France, should be approved.
- 40. It was so agreed.

Paragraphs 251 and 252

41. Paragraphs 251 and 252 were approved.

Paragraph 253

- Mr. ILBOUDO (Upper Volta) said that, as a representative of one of the least developed among developing countries, he thought that the Board should define its attitude concerning the point raised in paragraph 253.
- 43. Mr. NSANZIMANA (Rwanda) suggested that the words "one delegation" should be replaced by the words "several delegations".
- 14. It was so agreed.
- 45. Paragraph 253. as amended by the delegation of Rwanda, was approved.

46. After a short discussion, Mr. BOYCE (United Kingdom) suggested that the words "the same delegation" should be replaced by the words "one of these delegations".

After a discussion, in which Mr. ROBERTS (Canada), Mr. ARCHIBALD (Trinidad and Tobago) and Mr. SHATSKY (Union of Soviet Socialist Republics) participated, Mr. ARCHIBALD (Trinidad and Tobago) suggested that the words "since its membership did not include the group of socialist countries" should be replaced by "since the group of socialist countries was not participating in it".
- 52. Mr. SHATSKY (Union of Soviet Socialist Republics) said that the suggestion made by the representative of Trinidad and Tobago was acceptable to his delegation.
- 53. The amendment, as amended, was approved.

Paragraph 250

- 54. Mr. BITTENCOURT (Brazil) said that he would have liked some mention to be made of the view expressed by his delegation that UNCTAD, and not ECOSOC, was the most appropriate forum for the discussion of matters pertaining to the Second Development Decade.
- 15. The PRESIDENC pointed out that the Brazilian delegation's views on that matter had already been incornerated in the section of chapter II of the final report which dealt with the Second Bovelopment Decade.

- 66. The FRESIDENT suggested that the secretariat should be requested to make the appropriate changes in the French and Spanish texts.
- 67. It was so agreed.
- 68. Mr. VAVASSEUR (France), supported by several other delegations, suggested that the words "as far as possible" should be inserted after the word "should" in sub-paregraph (d).
- 69. It was so agreed.
- 70. Paragraph 2. as amended. was approved.

- 74. Mr. GIINSKI (Poland) proposed the addition of the following sentence: "One delegation emphasized that UNIDO must focus its activities on the main industrialization problems and not attempt to deploy them in all fields of industry."
- 75. Mr. NDOUNG (Comeroon) suggested that the proposed Polish text might be emended to "One delegation suggested that UNIDO ...".
- 76. Mr. SHATSKY (Union of Soviet Socialist Republics) pointed out that his delegation has also drawn attention to the need for UNITO to focus its activities on the main industrialization problems.
- Mr. LORENZI (Uruguay), supported by Mr. SIERRA (Spain), said that a number of delegations had also referred to the matter during the discussions; he therefore proposed that the additional sentence proposed by Poland should begin: "Some delegations suggested that UNIIO ..."

78. It was no agreed.

- 79. Mr. LERENA (Argentina) proposed that the first sentence in the paragraph should be amended to read: "Some delegations referred to the need to avoid waste of efforts, or activity prejudicial to assistance to developing countries, arising from duplication.".

Mr. BILLNER (Sweder), Rapportour, said that the idea behind the paragraph had already been expressed in the sentences which had just been added to paragraph 3 of document ID/R/L.44/Add.6 by the Italian delegation. He therefore suggested that, to avoid duplication, the paragraph might be shortened to read: "Another delegation referred to its statement on the same matter in paragraph 3 of document ID/B/L.44/Add.8.".


- 108. Mr. MORRONE (Italy) agreed to the Rapporteur's suggestion.
