## INTRODUCTION

The Workshop on *“POPs Destruction Technologies and Decision Support Tools for their assessment and selection”* held in Mahmudia, Tulcea county, Romania, was organized by ICS-UNIDO – the International Center for Science and High Technology of the United Nations Industrial Development from Trieste, in collaboration with the National Research & Development Institute for Environment Protection - ICIM Bucharest.

Among the different kinds of contamination, POPs, such as pesticides and PCBs, represent one of the most serious and urgent problems to be faced, because of their large diffusion in the environment on one hand, and because of their particular characteristics and properties which determine their persistence in waters and soils on the other hand. Moreover, the large amount of abandoned stockpiles of obsolete pesticides represents a further problem for many developing countries, both in terms of their management under safe environmental and human health conditions and in terms of technical as well as economic resources to be implied for their destruction.

The International Centre for Science and High Technology (ICS-UNIDO), with the aim of improving capacity building of developing countries in the development and adoption of new catalytic technologies for pollution prevention and POPs destruction and in the implementation of Decision Support Tools for the relevant technology evaluation and selection, is carrying out a programme of initiatives like workshops and meetings of experts, where methodologies and tools for a proper approach to deal with POPs related issues in developing countries are discussed and the possibility of concerted actions and joint projects are explored.

Within the ICS Work Programme for year 2006, such a strategy was strengthened and the Workshop on *“POPs Destruction Technologies and Decision Support Tools for their assessment and selection”*, which has been held from 28 to 29 August in Mahmudia, Romania, represents an implementation of the above mentioned programme.

In the last years several non-combustion technologies, in particular those based on catalytic processes, have been developed and many of them have proved to be very promising to handle safe POPs destruction. Catalytic technologies are also a key element in up-stream strategies for pollution prevention and cleaner industrial production in developing countries. Nevertheless, the evaluation of applicability and sustainability of the different technical options represents a challenging task in the decision making processes, when a wide range of information, issues and needs are involved in the management of POPs related problems and efficient and cost effective decisions have to be taken. For these reasons, the development and adoption of new methodologies and instruments (Decision Support Tools) for facilitating decision makers to perform objective evaluations and identify suitable solutions represent a key element for sustainable and environment friendly industrial processes in developing countries.

The status of POPs pollution and the relevant prevention policies and decontamination strategies markedly differ between different regions of the world and between countries of a same region, because of the different socio-economic and industrial situation in the past

and the present time. A proper planning and management of environmental problems, the introduction and implementation of suitable hazardous waste destruction technologies together with the introduction of environment friendly production processes, are the key factors to face these problems.

Some new approaches and tools are nowadays becoming available for a proper management of POPs related problems and ICS is then promoting their introduction, development and application and contributing to strengthen national capabilities with adequate programmes and initiatives in developing countries and economies in transition.

The above mentioned event was particularly focused on defining suitable common initiatives and on promoting joint projects. In order to identify and define suitable strategies/actions for the countries of the region, the Workshop was focused on the following general key topics:

- *"Capacity building and knowledge transfer in the field of POPs destruction technologies CEE countries"*, in which the ways for promoting the introduction of effective tools and technologies for POPs destruction in the region will be explored and discussed, also identifying priorities and promoting specific projects/initiatives in the field.
- *"Decision Support Tools for technology evaluation and selection"*, in which the introduction and use of DSTs in developing countries for POPs destruction technologies assessment and selection, will be discussed. Emerging non-combustion techniques for POPs treatment will be taken into account in order to verify their possible applicability and sustainability in the countries.

Representatives of environmental authorities, research, academic and industrial institutions as well as environmental NGOs from Romania participated in the event. Also, the focal points for the Stockholm Convention from eight CEE and NIS countries attended the Workshop.

The local organizer, National Research-Development Institute for Environmental Protection (ICIM Bucharest) is a national institute co-ordinated by the Romanian Ministry of Environment and Water Management and performs complex researches and studies in the field of environmental protection and engineering, with accent on the management of waters, air and eco zones. ICIM is one of the largest and most vigorous environmental institutions in Romania. It is composed of strong, distinctive and coherent groups of researchers.

ICIM has implemented many projects, mostly with the assistance of International Organizations. It developed fruitful co-operation with UNIDO, Phare, the World Bank, RAMBOLL - Denmark; HALCROW - United Kingdom; HASKONING - The Netherlands; EPTISA - Spain; JICA - Japan; GIB - UK etc.

The main topics of these co-operations were the development of national and local

environmental action programmes, monitoring, laboratory analyses and data processing. National reviews and reports and assessment studies regarding the improvement of environmental management at local and central level were also implemented. Monitoring of transboundary pollution and the development of environmental legislations are also among its services.

The Workshop has been held in Mahmudia, - a symbolic place - where a large part of Europe (namely a number of about 200 million people) is connected to the Black Sea, via the Danube River, affecting the ecosystems located on this large corridor.

## **OBJECTIVES**

The main objectives of the meeting are defined as follows:

- To survey the state-of-the art of catalytic technologies for hazardous waste destruction and POPs pollution prevention and to promote their adoption in the region
- To promote the introduction and implementation of Decision Support Tools for the assessment of technologies for destruction of POPs and related hazardous compounds in the region
- To identify the main POPs related environmental problems in the region and to develop joint initiatives for their solution, also identifying the possible funding projects and schemes.

## **ORGANIZATION**

The Workshop on "Sustainable Plastics, EDPs and the Use of Renewable Feedstocks in CEE and NIS countries" was jointly organized by the International Center for Sciences and High Technology of the United Nation Industrial Development Organization (ICS-UNIDO), with headquarters in Trieste, in collaboration with the National Research & Development Institute for Environment Protection - ICIM Bucharest.
