ENCOURAGING YOUNG PEOPLE AND UNDERSERVED COMMUNITIES TO DEVELOP INNOVATIVE AND CREATIVE MOBILE E-CONTENT

INTRODUCTION

Within the framework of the Ghanaian Web Excellence Award (WEA), which serves as the national pre-selection for the global World Summit Award (WSA), the Ghana-India Kofi Annan Center of Excellence in ICT, together with UNIDO and WSA organized a two-day event, which formed part of the Innovation week, and included a Plenary Session on Mobile Content & Digital Innovation on day 1 (mobile content day) and a FOSS Practitioners & Investment Bankers Forum as well as a session on FOSS for SMEs - Practical Business Models for SMEs on day 2 (Business day). The workshop aimed to give selected Ghanaian mobile content producers a platform to present their projects to an expert audience, including delegates from UNIDO and the Ghanaian government. These activities underlined and raised awareness for the importance of quality content development in Ghana.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Purpose of the event

Information and Communication Technologies (ICT) represent key elements for economic and social development in Sub-Saharan Africa. In sectors such as education, administration and business development, sustainable local ICT service providers, ICT-driven businesses, IT-experts, and innovation managers, particularly in the promising field of Free and Open Source Software (FOSS) need to be encouraged and given exposure for business opportunities.

The Advanced Information Technology Institute, Kofi Annan Centre of Excellence in ICT (AITI-KACE) has been working in partnership with the World Summit Awards (WSA) since 2005 to promote globally benchmarked e-content within Ghana. In 2007, Ghana's entry in the e-Government category won a special award for the best entry from Africa. AITI-KACE also organizes the annual national Web Excellence Awards (WEA). As a result of the increasing importance of mobile content within the Ghanaian market and in emerging markets in general, a decision was taken to expand the scope of the WEA to include mobile phone applications. One of the specific goals is to encourage innovative use of the mobile platform to support services to under served locations and communities. In order to learn from global best practice a decision was taken to partner with WSA to host a Road Show around the theme of mobile content.

Brief Corporate Profile of AITI-KACE:

The Ghana-India Kofi Annan Centre of Excellence in ICT was established jointly by the Government of Ghana and the Government of India to offer ICT services to individuals, institutions and organizations in the ECOWAS sub-region. AITI-KACE supports ICT professional development and the growth of the ECOWAS ICT Sector by providing market-oriented ICT training in Software Application Development, Multimedia Content Development, Networking Technologies, Database Technologies, etc. AITI-KACE also engages in applied research into innovative technologies and professional consulting activities that advance the socio-economic development of the region.

AITI-KACE is working to expand its multi-media department by initiating collaboration with top web developers in the sub-region to raise the quality and quantity of African content on the web, and expanding the range of courses it offers in this area.

The Centre works to build relevant ICT skills to help Ghana and other countries in the sub-region to overcome the digital divide and meet the challenges of the ICT-led global economic drive.

In his role as CEO, Karanja has just completed a one-year long investment deal with Google Inc that saw the technology giant invest in a minority equity stake in Mobile Planet at the end of July 2008. Prior to founding Mobile Planet, Karanja was involved in the design, development and deployment of the first Electronic Funds Transfer Point of Sale (EFT-POS) network in Kenya in 1995. Karanja was educated at Trent University in Ontario, Canada where he obtained an undergraduate degree in Economics and Computer Science. Karanja also attended Bentley College in Waltham Massachusetts where he obtained a second Undergraduate degree in Information Systems.
