Subject: Al Hadaf Project, Final Report

After we had signed the contract with UNIDO to rehabilitate Al Hadaf project under specific conditions and limited period for these works(masonry, plaster, tiles, paint, woodwork, sanitary and electrical work), we had finished within the demanded period that is 3 months.

The project consists of two plots 1051 and 949, that is 14,000 m² and they are two floors, located in Beirut suburbs, Haret Hreik, Lebanon.

We suffered from the high humidity that attacked the whole basement floor and also from the slow motion in work from the other contractors that were responsible for the other building in the same estate.

The delay in handing over the work was caused by the:

- 1- The presence of other concrete contractors.
- 2- The presence of water infiltration from outside the building.

The work was finished and the project is delivered during the demanded period on Monday 9/11/2009 after the check of the National Coordinator of the Laiser Project Nada Barakat and the local engineer Salim Merhej and the approve of the owner Issam Wahid


