INTHODUCTION

The 1976 work programme of the International Centre for Industrial Studies has been developed by the staff of the Centre on the basis of the Programme Budget for 1976/1977 (A/C.5/1715/Rev.1); GA resolution 3362 (S=VII), section IV, para.7; GA resolution 3507 (XXX); and IDF resolution 45 (IX), operative para. 6.

The information contained in the project sheets is to facilitate issuance of the Project Allotment Documents (PADs). These sheets were evolved in the course of a number of extensive discussions with the entire staff of the Centre and with the individual Sections, elaborated by special interdisciplinary working teams of Centre staff members, and finalized at a general meeting of all staff members of the Centre.

Before implementation, the officer in charge of each project will develop detailed guidelines to be used by any consultants engaged by the Centre to work on the project.

Objectives:

To collect and analyze pertinent data from governments and international organizations with the aim of periodically reporting to the Industrial Development Board and the Permanent Committee in their capacity as monitoring bodies for the implementation of the Lima Declaration and Plan of Action on the action taken and the progress achieved along with suggestions for fuller and speedier implementation.

Description:

The data input required will be determined and a standardized format designed for information gathering from governments and international agencies with a view to institutionalizing the flow of pertinent information required for monitoring purposes. The information thus gathered, as well as that from other Sections of the Centre, will be consolidated and analyzed to form the basis of the Report by the Executive Director to the IDB on the communications received, along with comments and suggestions for fuller and speedier implementation of the Lima Declaration and Plan of Action. The following activities will be carried out in 1976:

- a. The required data input will be determined and a standardized format for information gathering designed;
- b. The material to be forwarded to governments and international agencies will be prepared (April);
- c. The data obtained will be analyzed and a draft report for submission to the IDB completed.

An analytical system for world industrial development forecasting and for monitoring the Lima targets on a continuous basis

Reference:

Objectives:

The objective of this project is to conceive and eventually construct a formalized, computer-based analytical framework depicting the world as a community of independent but interacting economic systems. Such a framework would serve as an efficient tool in predicting and analyzing the political and economic consequences of any major economic policy change contemplated by countries, individually or collectively. The Section's activities under the heading Monitoring Progress towards implementing the lima Declaration and Plan of Action will gradually become part of this long-term activity.

Description:

The proposed analytical framework - a "UNIDO World Industry Co-operation Model" - will contain all countries and 47 economic sectors. The design and construction of the Model will take several years. A two-pronged approach will be initiated in 1976:

- a. Work will begin on the design of a conceptual framework with the collaboration of several research centres;
- b. Concurrently, in order to obtain some immediate quantitative result of the consequences and implications of the Lima targets using the concept of a World Model, it is proposed to secure access to existing models such as the Bariloche World Model and the UNCTAD World Trade World.

Developing countries are frequently faced with the problem that their existing industrial capacities are under-utilized. The reasons for this are (e.g.) related to inefficient management and decision-making, high capital and production costs, and the limited size of domestic markets. A study will be undertaken in a selected country, in conjunction with local institutes, to identify the reasons for capacity under-utilization in order to arrive at conclusions for the formulation of remedial actions at various decision-making levels (plant, branch, economy). A meeting will be convened in the country in order to go over the results of the study and to prepare proposals for policy action.

Objectives:

To examine the impact of industrialization on Third World societies and to analyse the ways in which the industrialization process alters the values.

Description:

This subject will be dealt with initially through the preparation of five sutdies:

- a. Industrialization, income redistribution. This study will determine the socio-economic characteristics of poor income groups, both rural and urban, and the policies affecting them and assess whether income redistribution would involve a major sacrifice in terms of growth. Practical implications will be drawn regarding policy choice for achieving redistribution with growth.
- b. Target groups and the politico-administrative set-up. This will cover the above-mentioned groups with regard to the decision-making process, within the administrative and political set-up, worker participation and control, and access to eduction. The result will be to develop concepts of improving participation within the context of the industrialization process through an interdisciplinary approach.
- c. Interrelationship between agro-industry and rural development. This study will analyse the economic, social and cultural impact of agro-industrial projects with a view to improving techniques used in their preparation and planning. Emphasis will be on the impact such projects have had on the social and cultural values of the rural community.
- d. Human capital. This study will determine the extent to which investment in human capital has been a determinant of income differentials between and within countries. The result will be a significant contribution to drawing policy implications which may be taken up in development planning.
- e. A study will examine the impact of the pattern of consumer demand on the development of capita goods industries.

To disseminate general information about the activities of, and specific technical information from, the ICIS, to a targeted readership from the computerized mailing list.

Description:

The Industrial Research and Development News (IRDN), a glossy publication concentrating on disseminating high-quality articles on industrial research and industrial development, has suffered in recent years from lack of staff and internal resources.

Beginning in 1976, however, it will be reactivated. Each issue will contain 6 commissioned articles. Ten regional "stringers" (part-time technical journalists) will be recruited on a retainer basis to supply articles from their respective regions on significant industrial research and development activities. The "stringers" will be located in Asia (4), Africa (3), Latin America (2) and Middle East (1). In 1977 these 10, plus journalist experts from Europe and North America will gather in Vienna for an editor's roundtable (expert group meeting) aimed at improving 1RDN's long-range content, approach and appearance.

During 1976 two issues will be issued. In 1977 it is intended to produce four issues.

The Industrial Information Section will continue to publish the monthly UNIDO Newsletter.

Objectives:

To study the establishment and operation of the institutional infrastructure for industry in developing countries, particularly the least developed, with a view of accelerating the implementation of the goals of the Lima Declaration and Plan of Action.

Description:

The first stage of the two-year project will be an assessment of the implications of the goals and targets of the Lima Declaration for the institutional infrastructure of developing economies, and a field survey of the institutional infrastructure of 10 developing countries. Concurrent with the survey, local institutions in three developing countries will be commissioned with the performance of in-depth studies of the industrial institutional machinery in their countries, based on their own experience in this field.

In the subsequent stage the results of the survey and studies will be analysed with a view to identifying the most appropriate means of strengthening local institutional capabilities and expediting decision-making processes. The dialogue thus initiated will be developed in the course of 1977 and a meeting held to discuss the strengthening and streamlining of institutional infrastructure as a means of furthering industrial development.

Better utilization of domestic natural resources is a major objective of the developing countries which may be realized through increased industrial processing of raw materials by domestic industry. The study will evaluate recent progress made by developing countries in increasing the degree of domestic industrial transformation. It will also focus on possible actions for attaining this objective.

Description:

After identifying the present status of both the developing and the developed countries with regard to the extent of industrial natural resource transformation, the study will consider selected problem areas and possible policy actions. Examples of problem and policy matters that may be discussed include trade policies which discourage the developing countries from transforming their natural resources domestically; investment policies in both developed and developing countries; the investments of transnationals that can affect the location of transformation facilities, etc.

The types of training activity currently delivered by or through UNIDC, in the form of in-plant group training programmes or individual fellowships for training largely in developed countries and which benefit a relatively small elite of technical and managerial key personnel in developing countries, must be augmented by training on a larger scale in the developing countries themselves.

Description:

The following studies will be carried out:

- (a) to make an inventory of non-formal training programmes for industrial development by both private and public agencies in a selected number of developing countries at different levels of injustrial development in order to establish the relationship between the priority, quantity and type of training programmes as a function of the level of development;
- (b) to evaluate some existing training programmes based on levy grant financing both in developed and developing countries and to determine their applicability to a selected developing country;
- (c) to study the methods used by the multi-national companies in non-formal training of their manpower, both in developed and in developing countries, and to determine the applicability of these methods to training for large private or public companies in one or two selected developing countries:
- (d) to study to what extent <u>learning</u> by doing in one selected country can be made more efficient by providing UNIDO inputs in addition to the work environment.


