

The permanent headquarters of the association shall be located in a country of one of the full neaber institutions to be determined by the General Associaty, which may also decide to change the location of the accountry headquarters if need be.

Article III

OBJECTIVES OF THE ASSOCIATION

The objectives of the association shall be:

- 1. To promote co-operation among the African countries in Industrial and Technological assemble and Dovelopment through, inter alia, the establishment of links between African institutions a materned with industrial and technological research and development for the exchange of information, experience capabilities and facilities, as a propriete:
- 2: To promote co-peration between drican industrial and technological research institutes, relevant departments and units of Universities and the organized industrial sectors;
- 3. To premate the establishment of links between the association and similar bodies and other relevant international organizations:
- 4. To promote the establishment of links bewtween member inscitutions, as requested, with institutions in other parts of the world;

- 5. To contribute towards the ideatefrection and periodic review of the needs and requirements of Africa, on a regional or sub-regional level, in industrial and technological research and development:
- 6. To promote and assist an defining joint industrial and technological research development projects and help, as need be, in locating finance for such projects:
- 7. To contribute towards the co-ordination and planning of industrial and technological research and development in africa;
- 8. To contribute towards upgrading the level of skills of personnel and the development of nanpower requirements for industrial and technological research and development in africa;
- 9. To provide assistance to member institutions in obtaining finance for industrial and technological research and development projects of regional or sub-regional importance:
- To promote the strengthening of existing industrial and technological research and development institutions in africa and the establishment of new ones where these do not exist, as a means of up-grading the level of industrial and technological research and development in africa;
- 11. To establish official recognition with the OAU and other relevant international organizations and collaborate with the OAU/STRC in expressing Africa's view point on industrial and technological research and development matters;
- To premote the effective transfer of industrial technology, particularly the commercialization of research and development results.

Article IV

FUNCTIONS OF THE ASSOCIATION

- organization, operating as a professional autonomous organization, shall carry out such activities as are necessary to enable it attain its objectives. As a bons fide Association constituted under the aggis of the OAU, the association shall act as the technical arm of the Scientific Council of Africa and the STRC, liaise with other relevant international arganizations, and express Africa's view point on all matters related to industrial and technological research and development in Africa. It shall be responsible for making recommendations to the Scientific Council of Africa on industrial and technological policies of the OAU for implementation at the regional and national levels, as appropriate.
- As a professional organization, it is expected that the activities of the Association would contribute towards increasing the industrial and technological capacity of Africa as well as the effectiveness of its member institutions in the industrial and technological development of their respective countries in particular and of Africa as a whole. These activities shall, in particular, include the following:
 - (a) To initiate and assist in the implementation of joint programmes and eq-eperation in industrial and technological research and development not only among its members but also between its members and other relevant institutions in Africa and other parts of the world;
 - (b) To collect information on a regional and worldwide basis relevant to the activities of the Association and disseminate it among its member institutions:

- (c) To prepare and publish periodically, in collaboration with other international organizations as appropriate, up-dated directories on various aspents of industrial and technological research and development including institutions, renearch programmes, facilities, information centres, training programms and opportunities, and personnel involved in industrial and technological research and development in Africa.
- international organisations, studies for the identification of the needs of Africa, at a regional or sub-regional level, in general or specific aspects of industrial and technological research and development and to take follow-up action with the relevant authorities at the national, regional and/or international levels for the implementation of the findings and recommendations of such studies;
- (e) To identify and define, in collaboration with member institutions, joint industrial research and development projects, especially those dealing with the commercialisation of research results and of special importance to a number of African countries and to take follow-up action with funding agencies for the financing of such projects:

- countries for the protection of intellectual industrial property developed in or outside africa in connection with research programmes involving african participation and to assist, in collaboration with relevant international organizations, african countries in establishing effective machineries at the national and regional levels, as appropriate;
- To assist in the location of training opportunities, consultants for special projects, and in the organization of staff exchanges between member institutions;
- international organizations, such tours, seminars, workshops and other nectings on a regional or subregional basis on general and selected aspects of industrial and technological research and development in Africa.

Article V

MEMBERSHIP OF THE ASSOCIATION

- 1. The membership of the Association shall consist of Full and Associate members:
 - (a) Full members shall consist of African institutions actively involved in industrial and technological research and developments
 - (b) Associate Members whall consist of African institutions not actively engaged in industrial or technological research and development but interested in promoting the sims and aspirations of the Association.
- 2. Application for membership shall be made by each institution on the Association's application form, in accordance with its local procedures, to the Secretary-General of the Association.
- Conoral to all members of the Executive Committee who shall indicate their approval or disapproval of the admission of each applicant. The Secretary-General shall, on the basis of unanimous positive replies received from all members of the Executive Committee admit, on behalf of the Association, the new member. In case of any objection, the Executive Committee shall direuse the application at its next recting and, if no positive decision is reached on the admission of the applicant, the matter shall then be referred to the next meeting of the General Assembly for final decision.
- 4. An institution shall be considered to have accepted membership of the Association when it indicates, in writing to the Secretarist, its commitment to abide by the Statutes and Rules of Procedure of the Association and pay its membership foce.
- 5. All new members admitted by the Executive Committee during its term of effice shall be reported to the next General Assembly.

- 6. The Executive Committee shall recommend the termination of the membership of an institution to the description, which shall take the first decision.
- 7. Termination of an inaltution's membership shall be considered when the actions of the institution are decad to be contrary to the aims, objectives and interests of the Accordation.
- Tordination of an institution's membership shall also be considered when, after reminders from the Secretaries, as indication is received from the institution of the steps taken to transmit its membership foos to the Secretaries within the stipulated time limit.

Article VI

ARCEPA, ARTTE TOTAL AND INVESTOR OF COMME

- to Hothers of the Astroiation shall:
 - (a) Propagate the aims, objectives and activities of the Association and shall abide by the desistems of the General Associates and the Inscutive Committees
 - (b) Contribute towards the schiovement of the aims and objectives of the Accordation by, fator alta, participating, as appropriate, in the work of the Association;
 - (c) Pay their relevant numbership food, the amount of which shall be established from time to time by the General Assembly:
 - (4) Receive materials published by the Association.
- Poli numbers of the Association shall additionally have the right to :
 - (a) Votes
 - (b) Do elected to the permanent organs and effices of the Accostation as appropriate; and

(c) Nominate representatives of member institutions for election to the permanent organs and effices of the Association.

Article VII

HUMBERSHIP PERS

- The amount of membership fees shall be established from time to time by the General Assembly.
- 3. Such member shall be required to pay its membership fee within the first three mentls of the commensement of the financial year of the Association. The case of any member failing to pay its membership for chall be referred to the Squeutive Committee.
- 3. All membership fees shall be paid in ecuvertible surremay.

Article Yill

ORGANS OF THE ASSOCIATION

- 1. The permanent organs of the Association shall be:
 - (a) The General Assembly:
 - (b) The Brecutive Committee; and
 - (c) The Secretariat.
- 8. Other permanent organs of the Association may be established, so need be, by the General Assochiy.
- 3. The Conoral Assembly and Rescutive Committee any set up subcommittees of technical working groups, as need to, to against in the expection of their functions.

Article II

THE GENERAL ASSESSED

to: The Conoral Assembly shall be the supreme organ of the Assessation.

- by the President of the Association and shall take place at least once every three years in one of the countries where members of the Association are located. The Secretary-General shall be the Secretary at all meetings of the General Assombly without a voting right.
- The least fifty per cent of the full members of the Association shall be required to constitute a quorum at meetings of the General Assembly and its decisions shall be made by a simple majority of the members voting except as specified in Article SVIII of these Statutes. Special meetings of the General Association on the request of at least two-thirds of full members of the Association.
- the item of the agenda which shall be prepared in accordance with the Bules of Procedure of the General Assembly and shall take decisions accordingly.
- 4. The General Assembly shall, in particular,
 - (a) Hold technical discussions on selected aspects of industrial and technological research and development in Africa:
 - (b) Review and adopt the reports of the President and the Secretary-General on the activities of the Association;
 - (e) Block the officers and other members of the Baseutive Committee of the Association;
 - (4) Appoint the Secretary-General of the Association;
 - (e) Review and docide upon the recommendations of the Empeutive Committee on special matters including the admittance of new numbers into the Association, emminents to the Statutes and Nules of Freedure, and membership fees; and
 - (f) Review and adopt the Association's Suture work programme and budget.

Articlo X

THE BERCUTIVE COMMITTEE

- The Executive Committee shall be the permanent organ of the Association responsible for directing the activities of the Association in the interval between sessions of the General Assombly and shall have the powers of the General Assombly during this period.
- S. Numbers of the Executive Committee shall consist of the efficers of the Association as well as any other ex-officion members elected by the General Association.
- 3. The efficers of the Executive Committee shall consist of: Chairman:

Piret Vice-Chairman; and Second Vice-Chairman.

The President, first Vice-President and second Vice-President of the Association shall be the Chairman, first Vice-Chairman and second Vice-Chairman of the Emocutive Committee respectively.

- 4. The Secretary-General shall be the Secretary of the Se
- 5. The Brocutive Committee shall commence its duties from the end of the General Assembly at which it is sleeted until a new Descutive Committee is elected.
- 6. Requier meetings of the Executive Committee shall be convened by the Chairman at least once a year.
- 7. Special meetings of the Executive Committee shall also be convened by the Chairman at the request of at least two-thirds of its members.
- 8. Mostings of the Amountive Committees shall take place with at least two-thirds of the members present and its decisions shall be made by a two-thirds majority of the members present except for the admission of new members for which a unanimous

decision is required. Each member of the Buccutive Committee shall have one vote.

- 9. The Bascutive Committee shall establish its own rules of precedure. Such rules of precedure shall be in accordance with the guidelines established by the General Assembly.
- 10. At its meeting, the Executive Committee shall consider the items of the Agenda which shall be established in accordance with its rules of procedure and shall take decisions or adopt recommendations to the General Assembly accordingly.
- 11. The Smooutive Committee shall, in particulars
 - (a) Neview special cases concerning the admission or re-admission of new numbers and the termination of numbership;
 - (b) Noview and adopt recommendations to the Comeral Assembly, econocraing the appointment or termination of aggeletapet of the Scoretary-Comeral;
 - (e) Noview the implementation of the work programs and financial status of the Association and, on the backs of drafts prepared by the Sourceasy-Constal, propose future work programmes and budgets of the Association for approval by the General Association
 - (6) Commider proposals on the amondments of the Statutes of the Association and make recommendations to the General Associaty accordingly:
 - (e) Provide the Secretary-General with directives on appearal issues including action necessary for the implementation of the activities and work programs of the Association; and
 - (f) Provide overall direction and supervision of the detailed planning and implementation of the activities of the Association including the Secretariat.

Article XI

OFFICERS OF THE ASSOCIATION

- 1. The officers of the Association shall consist of:
 - (a) The President:
 - (b) The first Vice-President;
 - (e) The second Vice-President; and
 - (d) Representatives or alternates of somes which shall be determined from time to time by the General Assembly.
- 8. Only representatives of full members of the Association who are in good standing chall be eligible for nominating, voting and for election in their individual capacities, to the offices of the Association. No more than one officer of the Association shall be elected from one country.
- 3. The term of office of the officers of the Ass station chail be the period between the end of regular General Assembly meeting in which they are elected and the end of the next one, and shall expire when the new officers take office. Back officer shall be eligible for re-election for only one more consecutive term.
- The President shall be the head of the Association and shall represent it at all occasions. He shall convene and preside ever all meetings of the General Assembly. The President of the Association shall also be the Chairman of the Succutive Committee.
- S. The President shall submit reports, preposals and decisions taken by the Executive Committee to the General Assembly on the activities of the Association undertaken during his period of effice.
- 6. In the absence of the President the first Vice-President chall exercise the powers and earry out the functions of the President.

 The second Vice-President shall then assume the functions of

the first Vice-President. The first Vice-President shall also be responsible for ensuring that the overall management of the Association's funds are in accordance with the approved budget and the regulations established by the Executive Committee to which he shall report accordingly.

- 7. In the absence of the President or first Vice-President, the second Vice-President shall exercise the powers and carry out the functions of the President. In the absence of the first Vice-President, the second Vice-President shall assume his functions.
- 8. In the case of permanent absonce of the President, the first Vice-President or second Vice-President of the Association, who Resoutive Committee shall elect one of its members to fill the vecant post.
- 9. In the absence of the President and the first and second VicePresidents, the Executive Committee shall elect one of its
 members to carry out the functions of the President, In the
 tase of permanent absence, he shall then convenes special
 meeting of the General Assembly to elect a new President and the
 Vice-Presidents.
- 10. In the case of permanent absence of a representative or alternate of a zene, the Executive Committee shall, in consultation with the numbers of the sone, select one member of the sone to fill the vacancy.
- 11. The Representatives or alternates of the mones shall!-
 - (a) Represent the President of the Association in their sense;
 - (b) Act as correspondents to the Secretary-General by co-ordinating the activities of the Association in their sense:
 - (e) Represent members of their nones and reflect their ecilective views to the Socretary-General and at meetings of the Emecutive Committee on all matters related to the work of the Association;

- (4) Organise such activities, as deemed necessary, to prepagate
 the sime and objectives of the Association in their sense;
- (e) Undertake such other functions as may be assigned to-them by the Executive Committee in accordance with the everall policies of the Association established by the General Assembly.

Article XII

SECRETARIAT AND SECRETARY-GENERAL

- to-day activities of the Association in accordance with the Mules and Regulations established by the Executive Committee.
- 3. The Secretariat shall consist of the Secretary-General and other administrative and technical staff appointed by the Secretary-General in accordance with the terms and conditions laid down by the Seccutive Committee that may be required for carrying out such duties.
- The Secretariat shall be located at the permanent headquarters of the Association, unless otherwise decided by the General Association.
- 4. The Secretary-General shall be the chief executive efficer of the Secretariat. He shall be appointed by the General Accordiy and shall be eligible for re-appointment upon the expiration of his contract.
- 5. In case the post of Secretary-General becomes vacant before
 the empiration of the term of office of the incumbent, the
 Brocutive Committee shall appoint an Acting Secretary-General
 until the next one is appointed by the General Assembly.
- 6. As chief executive officer of the Secretariat, the Secretary-

- (a) Report to the Executive Committee on the day-to-day
 work of the Association, and as Secretary to that Committee
 he shall be responsible for preparing material, especially
 draft reposals for the Association's work programme and
 budget, for discussion at its meeting;
- (b) Report to the General Assembly at its regular meetings on the details of the activities of the Associations
- (e) Act as Secretary at the Executive Committee and General Assombly meetings and ensure that the minutes of these meetings are finalised and circulated to all members of the Association and other interested parties as appropriate;
- (d) De responsible for keeping members of the Association regularly informed of the activities of the Association;
- (e) Initiate action to ensure the implementation of the work ... programme of the Association:
- (f) So authorised to collect and disburse funds, in accordance with financial rules and procedures which shall be established and reviewed from time to time by the Emerative Committee to which he shall report periodically on the financial status of the Association;
- (g) Initiate and maintain contacts at the working level with other international associations and organizations under the everall direction of the Executive Committee.
- 7. In the postermance of his dutien, the Secretary-General shall not seek nor receive instructions from any member, country or authority external to the Association except as specified in the Statutes.
- So Such member of the Association, country or organization dealing with the Association shall respect the international character of the work of the Secretary-General and his staff and shall not cash to adversely influence them in the despatch of their respectibilities.

Article XIII

FINANCING

- 1. Punds of the Association shall be derived from:
 - (a) Annual membership fees;
 - (b) Annual allocation by the OAU through the Scientific Council of Africa/STRC:
 - (e) Assistance by Governments, national agencies, international organizations such as UNIDO, industrial and commercial enterprises, and individuals interested in promoting the aims and objectives of the Association;
 - (d) Revenue from other sources, including the sale of publications.
- The Emecutive Committee shall determine the precedure for raising, helding, investing, disbursing and administering the funds and casets, movable and immovable, of the Accestation in accordance with general guidelines to be established by the General Assembly and the Rules of Precedure of the Accestation.
- 3. The financial year of the Association shall be the Gregorian valendar year, that is, from 1st January to 31st Secondar of each year.

Article HY

LANGUAGES

The working languages of the Association shall be Ingitch and French.

article XV

Amendments, additions and deletions to these Statutes and suspensions, and the Rules of Procedure of the Association shall be made by a two-thirds majority decision by the full members of the Association.

Article XVI

WITHDRAWAL FROM MEMBERSHIP

- 1. Any member may withdraw from the Association by submitting a written notification to the Secretary-General.
- 2. The request of a member fulfilling the above provision shall be granted after the member has fulfilled all its outstanding obligations due to the Association.

Article XVII

DISSOLUTION

- The Association may be dissolved at any time if a decision to that effect is made by two-thirds of the full members of the Association.
- 2. The above decision shall provide for the discharge of all liabilities and the disposal of all funds or assets of the Association.
- J. Any assets, after liquidating outstanding Cobts, shall be donated to an international african organisation working in the field of industrial and technological research and development selected by the General Assembly.

Article XVIII

VOTING

1. Only full members of the association shall be eligible to

- 2. Each full member shall have one vote.
- 3. Decisions of the Association shall be made by a simple majority of the members voting except as specified in item 4 below.
- 4. A two-thirds majority of the full members of the Association shall be required for:
 - (a) Amendment of the Statutes;
 - (b) Termination of membership
 - (e) Appointment and termination of the contract
 of the Secretary-General; and
- (d) Dissolution of the Association.


 Voting by mail shall be accepted and considered as valid at the seasons of the Conoral Assembly concerning the above issues.

Article XIX

LUSAL PROVESTORS
