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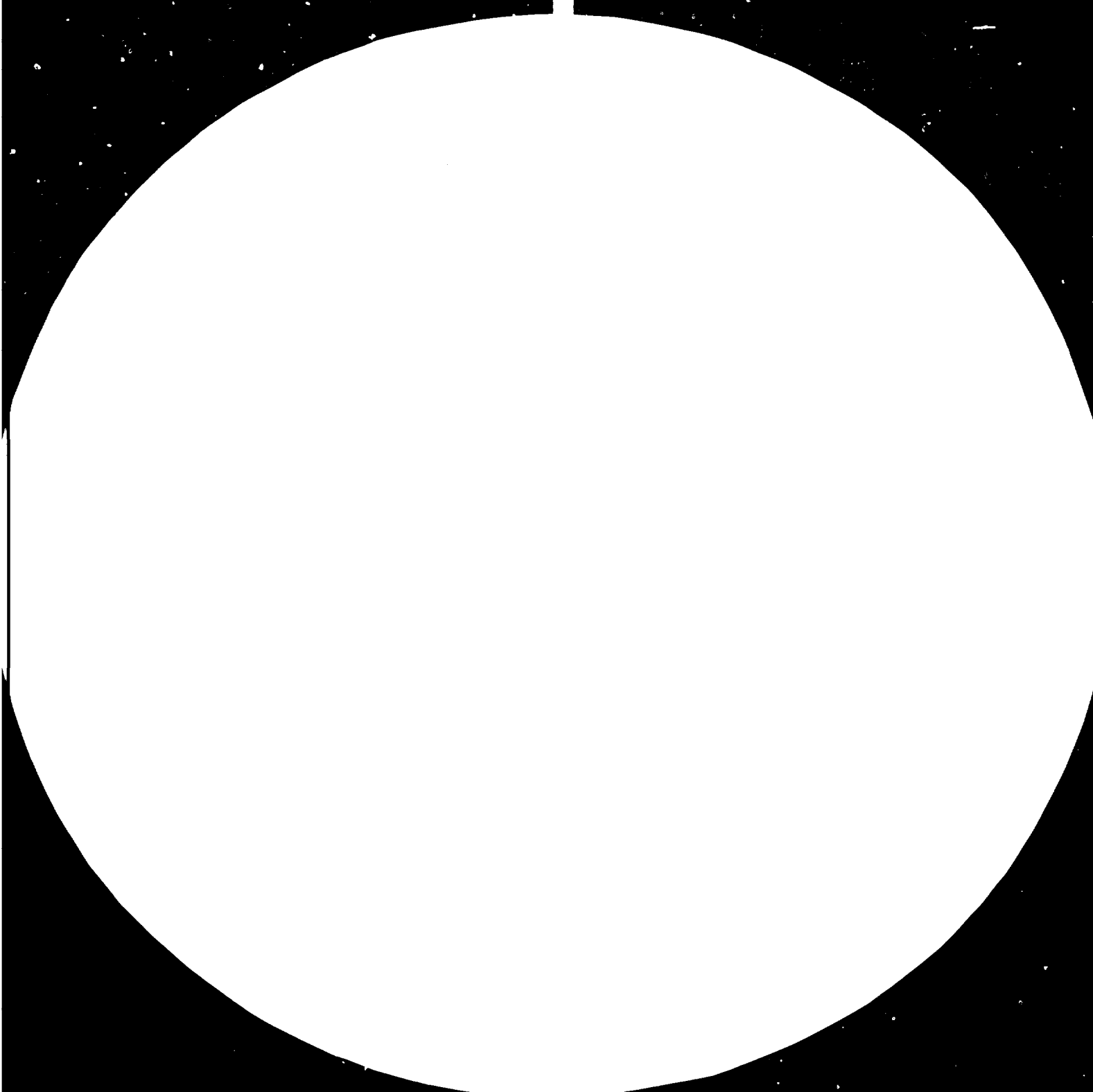

Timetable allows each Working Group 2 x one hour sessions with the Supplier Group and two one hour visits to special features of the pilot plant.
