### REPORT ON THE INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM titled

### "MOLECULAR MECHANISMS OF GENE EXPRESSION"

### SECOND EVENT IN THE SANTIAGO SOUTHERN SUMMER SYMPOSIA SERIE

Lecturers :

23 invited participants from abroad (Argentina, Belgium, Brazil, Costa Rica, Cuba, Denmark, France, Italy, Portugal, United States) as well as 4 Chilean lecturers and 8 distinguished Chilean Biologists chairing the 8 different sessions were invited.

Free Communications: 23 works were presented as "Posters" by Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, France, Mexico, Peru, Spain, United Kindgom, United

Bruquay, Venezuela.

- Fellowships:- 12 grants were given to young researchers from Argentina, Brazil, Colombia, Mexico, Peru and Venezuela representing partial financing of the airticket expenses and pocket money as well as exemption of registration fees.
  - 21 small fellowships were as well given to support travel expenses to Chilean students from regional universities, as well as exemption of registration fees.
  - 166 exemption of registration fees were given to students from pre y postgraduate.

An average attendance of 200 persons was daily estimated for the 3 days duration of the Symposium.

## Inauguration Ceremony:

The Symposium started with a short ceremony presided by Dr. Jaime Lavados, Rector of the University of Chile; Dr. Aleksandar Goic, Dean of the Faculty of Medecine of the University of Chile; Dr. Federico Welsch, Director of the National Cancer Institute of USA, International Relations Department; Dr. Norbel Galanti, Academic Director, Faculty of Medicine; Dr. Oscar Grau, Coordinator of the Latin American Regional Biotechnology Program sponsored by UNDP/UNIDO/UNESCO and Dr. Jorge E. Allende, chairman of the organizing committee. Drs. Allende, Welsch, Grau and Dean Goic spoke briefly to welcome the participants and to explain the objectives of the Symposium.

The development of the Symposium was highly satisfactory. The scientific level was the best possible due to the presence of well-known world-class researchers, such as Dr. Robert Weinberg of the Whitehead Institute for Biomedical Research Biology, Drs. Tjian and Yamamoto from the University of California, Drs. Weil, Hélène and Darlix from France and Dr. Arturo Falaschi, Director of the ICGEB-Trieste. Also latinamerican leaders such as Drs. Frasch and Kornblihtt from Argentina, Drs. Armelin from Brazil and Dr. Leon from Costa Rica.

Other noteworthy aspect was the participation of three distinguished Chilean researchers resident in foreign countries:Drs. Simon Litvak (France), Rodrigo Bravo (USA) and Danny Reinberg (USA). Their presence allowed them to take new contacts with Chilean groups working on similar themes.

The Symposium was extremely well received by the Chilean scientific community and especially by the students. It was stimulating to see the interest with which the students attended all the conferences although they were presented in English. It was well noted that foreign professors were dedicating their free moments to talk with latinamerican young researchers presenting posters in a very active workshop discussion.

Based on the positive results of these first two Symposia, we are already starting with optimism the task of organizing the third Symposium of the serie SANTIAGO SOUTHERN SUMMER SYMPOSIA which topic will concern "Molecular Biology of Cell Differentiation and Embryonic Development".
