Lecturers :

25 lecturers from abroad (Argentina, Belgium, Brazil, Ecuador, Germany, Italy, Mexico, United Kingdom, United States and Uruguay) as well as 4 Chilean lecturers and 7 distinguished Scientists from Chile and Argentina as chairpersons in these sessions, were invited.

Free Communications: 18 poster presentations of the work of graduate students and postdoctoral felllows from:
Argentina, Brazil, Ecuador, Mexico, Uruguay, USA,
Germany, Spain and Chile

Grants: - 12 grants were given to young researchers from USA,
Brazil, Argentina, Equador, Mexico and Uruguay,
representing partial participation in airticket
expenses and pocket money as well as liberation of
inscription fees.

- 23 grants were as well given as partial participation in travel expenses and pocket money to Chilean students from regional universities.
- 199 liberation of inscription fees were given to students from pre y postgraduate.

Attendance: There was a total of 282 registered participants.

An average attendance of 200 persons was daily estimated for the 3 days duration of the Symposium.

# Inauguration Ceremony:

The Symposium started with a short ceremony presided by the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine, Dr. Eduardo Rosselot, Dr. Federico Welsch, Director of International Relations Department of the National Cancer Institute; Dr. Francisco Barralle, Director of the Trieste Component of the ICGEB, Dr. Manuel Oyarzun. Academic Director of the Faculty of Medicine; Dr. Eddy De Robertis and Dr. Jorge E. Allende, co-organizers.

Drs. Allende, Welsch, Baralle and Dean Rossetol spoke briefly to welcome the participants and to explain the interest of their institutions in supporting this meeting.

## Comments by the Organizer:

The third meeting of the Santiago Southern Summer Symposia series was highly successful. The success was first due to the excellent level of the participants and to the care that these participants demonstrated in delivering exiting lectures on their latest research results. Lecturers included such world-class scientists such as Drs. P. Leder (Rarvard), J. Gurdon (Cambridge), F. Baralle (Trieste), M. Capecchi (Utah), P. Grüss (Göttingen), E. De Robertis (Los Angeles), F. Kafatos (EMBL-Heidelberg), A. Ghysen (Brussels), L. Zipursky (Los Angeles, I. Dawid (Bethesda), P. Marks (New York).

In addition, the program dedicated an important part of the time to the presentation of distinguished Latin American researchers such as: H. Torres (Buenos Aires), E. del Pino (Quito), R. Ehrlich (Montevideo), H. Merchant-Larios (Mexico), M. Brentani (Sao Paulo), A. Cáceres (Cordoba) and 4 chilean researchers: L. Burzio (Valdivia) and J. Fernandez, R. Mayor and C. Barros from Santiago.

Another important aspect that contributed to the success of the meeting was the fact that in addition to the exhibition of the posters, each of of these was asigned to one of the most distinguished lecturers from an oral 10 minute discussion during two poster discussion sessions scheduled at the end of the first two days. These sessions were very useful and stimulating for the young authors of these posters.

Finally the meeting was also successful in attracting an attendance of 282 registrants of which 190 were students.

In an effort to extend the benefits of the Symposium, all the lectures were recorded in Video and copies of these videos are being offered at cost to all interested in having them. Up to now more than 15 scientists have ordered copies to use them in doctoral-level courses.

Based on the great enthusiasm demonstrated by both the local and foreign participants, we are already starting the task of organizing the fourth workshop on the topic of: Genes and Genomes: Structure Mapping and Diversity.
