



TETRODUCT ION

The Secretariat of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization takes pleasure in presenting a directory of intergovernmental organizations at present co-operating with it.

The main aim of this directory is to introduce these organizations to each other so that organizations located in various continents become more familiar with each other's field of activity.

Contacts between these organizations, in the view of the Secretariat, will assist in eliminating any possible overlapping and/or duplication of activities. Furthermore, it will also provide a means for necessary economic integration both at regional and sub-regional levels.

Although UNIDO maintains good relations with more than a hundred intergovernmental organizations (other than those of the United Nations System) this directory contains only those organizations that are co-operating with the Secretariat. It is further hoped that after UNIDO becomes a specialised agency, more intergovernmental organizations would approach it to obtain observer status with the Industrial Development Board and/or to establish formal working arrangements with UNIDO.

This directory would be updated every two years, if necessary, to reflect the prevailing situation at that time.

To this end the Bank assists the investment of public and private capital in Africa; uses its own resources for the granting or guaranteeing of loans or for investment; encourages private investments in member States; co-operates with member States for the better utilisation of their resources by making their economies more complementary and by assisting harmonious expansion of their external trade; provides necessary technical assistance for the study, preparation, financing, and execution of development plans and projects. The Bank can grant direct or indirect credity. It can operate alone or in conjunction with other institutions or sources of finance:

a) Identification, preparation and appraisal of industrial investment projects for which financing through the Bank has been requested;

b) Evaluation of ongoing and completed projects financed by the Bank;

f) Training of professional and technical personnel to funiliarize them with Bank programmes, as well as arrangement of seminars and courses relating to industrial activities;

g) Preparation, execution of back-stopping of sectoral and industrial studies concerning individual countries, regions or subregions;

i) Co-ordination of policies and activities for the transfer and development of appropriate technology and know-how;

j) Collaboration in all areas referred to by the Lima Declaration and Plan of Action;

"Training cycle for African Development bankers in industrial projects preparation and evaluation."

On a request of the ADB which was received in May 1978, a project proposal was approved in December 1978 for the training of 20 member staff of African Development Bank and finance institutions in advanced methods and technics of identification, formulation and preparation of industrial projects. This project was completed in June 1980.





Although no formal instrument of co-operation so far has been established between OPEC and UNIDO, programmes of co-operation have already been and are being implemented especially with the OPEC Fund, particularly in the development of energy. They are also involved, on bilateral basis, in providing assistance to developing countries to accelerate their industrialization. The OPEC Fund was established in 1976 with the aim to provide financial assistance on highly concessional terms to developing countries. The initial endowment was US\$ 800 million. Later the amount was raised to more than US\$ 1.6 billion. The objective of the Fund is to promote the economic development as well as the international solidarity of the Third World. It was suggested that UNIDO could develop and implement industrial programmes/projects in the developing countries, financed either through grants and/or loans from the Fund.
