Workshop on Industrial Co-operation among Developing Countries in the Field of Agricultural Machinery and Agro-industries

Novi Sad, Yugoslavia, 16-20 May 1988

I. INTRODUCTION:

The workshop, implemented under the project XP/INT/88/011, was aimed at promoting and strengthening industrial co-operation among developing countries. In particular, the workshop's objective was to initiate industrial co-operation activities in the field of agricultural machinery and food processing industries.

The meeting was organized in connection with UNIDO's Third Consultation in Agricultural Machinery, held in Belgrade in 1986 (see UNIDO document ID/346). The Consultation meeting recommended, <u>inter alia</u>, that "in strengthening South-South co-operation, countries with an established agricultural machinery industry should co-operate with other developing countries in the establishment of a national agricultural machinery industry". Within this spirit and taking into consideration the well established co-operation activities between UNIDO and Yugoslavia the workshop was organized in co-operation with

- The Novi Sad International Agricultural Fair
- The Joint UNIDO-Yugoslavia Centre for International Co-operation in the Development of Agro-industries in Developing Countries
- The Solidarity Fund with Non-Aligned and Developing Countries of the Yugoslav Federal Executive Council, and
- The Federal Chamber of Economy of Yugoslavia.

The combination of the workshop with the 55th Movi Sad International Agricultural Fair and the exhibition of "Developing Countries in Struggle for Food" proved to be an excellent opportunity to provide the participants from the developing countries with viable industrial contacts and an overview of appropriate Yugoslav agricultural as well as food processing technologies.

II. ORGANIZATION OF THE MEETING:

The meeting, held in the Business Centre of the Novi Sad Fair, was attended by 26 participants from 21 invited developing countries. Moreover,

the meeting was also attended by 38 representatives of Yugoslav organizations and institutions (see attached list of participants: Annex I). The meeting was opened by Mr. D. Sterencev, the General Manager of the Novi Sad Fair, followed by welcome addresses from Mr. Z. Sudar, Head of Department for Developing Countries of the Federal Chamber of Econcmy, as well as from UNIDO. Dr. I. Radovic, Co-ordinator for African Developing Countries of the Yugoslav Federal Chamber of Economy, chaired the meeting.

The programme of the workshop (see Annex II) consisted of presentations by participants from developing countries on the specific problems faced in the field of agricultural machinery and food processing sectors. Specific presentations were made by Algeria, Botswana, Congo, Madagascar, Mali, Nigeria, Xwanda, Somalia and Zambia. Yugoslav specialized institutions and organizations presented papers on the status of agricultural machinery and agro-based industries in Yugoslavia and on possible co-operation offered by Yugoslav industrial enterprises and institutions (see Annex III).

UNIDO, FAO and IFAD representatives presented papers on the relevant activities in their organizations. Furthermore, the programme included bilateral discussions and demonstrations of various agricultural machinery and food processing equipment.

III. SUMMARY OF BILATERAL DISCUSSIONS ON INDUSTRIAL PROJECTS

After intensive deliberations between industrialists from the host country and participants from the developing countries, industrial projects were identified for follow-up action and possible implementation. In all cases the nature of co-operation, co-operating parties and follow-up action were clearly defined. The agreed projects cover areas such as production of agricultural machinery and implements, processing of agricultural products, food preservation and conservation, transfer of technology and training.

The results of the bilateral discussions can be summarized as follows:
