I. INTRODUCTION

The Technical Workshop for Selected Students from Developing Countries was organized by the UNIDO-Czechoslovakia Joint Programme, Non-metallic Industries, Pilsen⁺, in co-operation with Press Agency Orbis, Prague, for students studying the technical universities in Czechoslovakia.

The objective of the Workshop was to make the students form various developing countries acquainted with the integrated exploitation of non-metallic minerals and rocks, with the level of non-metallic industries in Czechoslovakia and also with the role and activities of the UNIDO, the Joint Programme, Pilsen and the Research Institute for Ceramics, Refractories and Non-metallic Raw Materials, Pilsen.

II. PARTICIPANTS

16 selected students from 12 developing countries took part in the Workshop. Their list is presented in Annex I.

III. LANGUAGE

The programme was conducted in Czech and English languages.

IV. ORGANIZATION OF THE WORKSHOP

Organization of the Workshop was ensured by the staff of the UNIDO-Czechoslovakia Joint Programme, Non-metallic Industries, Pilsen.

1. Programme of the Workshop

The programme of the Workshop comprehended industrial study visits to production plants on wall tile production (Westbohemian Ceramic Works, Horní Bříza) and kaolin excavation and dressing (Westbohemian Ceramic Works, kaolin washing plant, Kaznějov). The visits were enriched by the discussions giving the participants opportunity to extend their knowledge and to exchange their opinions and experience with managers and technical staff in the production plants.

A lecture presented by Mr. Z. A. Engelthaler, Chief Executive of the UNIDO-Czechoslovakia Joint Programme, Non-metallic Industries, Pilsen during afternoon was intended on the activities of the UNIDO and the Joint Programme, Pilsen and on the possibilities of a co-operation with various developing countries in the areas of ceramics, building materials and integrated utilization of non-metallic raw materials.

Mr. Z. A. Engelthaler informed the participants about possibilities to participate in future activities of the

Joint Programme such as fostering of twinning arrangements, individual and group training programmes (study tours, seminars, meetings, workshops, fellowships), testing of non-metallic raw materials, transfer of know-how and technologies to developing countries, energy management and conservation programme, environmental engineering and advanced ceramics programmes. The lecture was completed by round table discussions.
