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
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

Subregional Meeting on the Promotion of Intra-African Industrial Co-operation within the Framework of the Industrial Development Decade for Africa*

Bangui, Central African Republic, 20 - 24 February 1984

PROVISIONAL ANNOTATED AGENDA .

(<u>Meeting on intra-African</u> industrial cooperation).

(1) Opening of the Meeting: (Agenda Item No. 1)

As in the past, the Meeting will be opened by a senior official, preferably a Minister from the Host Country. Brief statements will also be made during the opening session of the Meeting by the Secretary General of OAU, the Executive Secretary of the ECA and the Executive Director of UNIDO, or their representatives. Representatives of the UDEAC and CEPGL would also make brief statements, if they so wish.

(2) Organization of the Meeting: (Agenda Item No. 2)

Following the reassumption of the Meeting, after its inaugural session, the Ghairman, usually from the Host Country, will be elected. He will thereafter preside over the Meeting during which the Vice-Chairmen and Rapporteur will be elected. The Agenda and Programme of the Meeting would be discussed, ammended, if need be, and adopted.

The Secretariat will provide information on the organization of the discussions at the Meeting. Information related to financial and administrative arrangements for the Meeting will also be provided by the Secretariat.

(3) <u>Development and Implementation of a Sub-regional Industrial Promotion</u> <u>Programme for the Industrial Development Decade for Africa</u> (Agenda Item No. 3)

The discussions at the Meeting are expected to focus on this item of the Agenda. The Secretariat will introduce discussions on the subject by briefly presenting the document prepared on it. Following this presentation, the Meeting is expected to devote half a day to deliberate on issues of a general nature arising from the document, as well as on areas in which multi-national core and other industrial projects can be developed in the sub-region. Two days of the Meeting would be devoted to considering the chapter of the document dealing with an initial integrated industrial promotion programme as well as on the plan for the implementation of the programme. All discussions will be conducted in plenary sessions. Working Groups may be set up, on an ad hoc basis, on matters which require further consultations to reach a consensus.

(4) Adoption of the Report of the Meeting: (Agenda Item No. 4)

It is expected that one day will be left open during which the Rapporteur of the Meeting will, with the assistance of the Secretariat, prepare the draft report of the Meeting including its conclusions and recommendations, as adopted by the Working Groups. During the next plenary session of the Meeting this report will be presented for its consideration and adoption. As in the past, it is expected that the Secretariat will be authorized to undertake the finalization of the report, taking into consideration all the comments made.

(5) Closing of the Meeting: (Agenda Item No. 5)

As usual, a representative of the Host Government will formally close the Meeting. It is also expected that statements will also be made by the representatives of the OAU, ECA, UNIDO and the participants.
