1. INTRODUCTION

The course was proposed as a response to a request from Sri Lankan Standards Institution (SLSI) via UNIDO, as a pre-cursor to the Institution becoming a Registration Body on behalf of the Sri Lankan Government.

The tutors nominated were Phil Sharland, Lead Tutor, and Dennis Marshall, both full-time P-E Batalas Consultants. Phil Sharland was previously involved in an EEC-sponsored course for the Bureau of Indian Standards in Madras during February 1991. The programme and timings were notified to SLSI in July 1992.

2. DELEGATES

The delegates for this course were as previously notified to P-E Batalas and included in the course manual. There were no substitutions. The delegate list is at Appendix A.

3. VENUE

The venue for this course was the Amethyst Suite of the Hilton Hotel, Colombo, Sri Lanka. The layout and facilities were adequate and met all the requirements previously stated by P-E Batalas in their contract conditions.

4. THE COURSE

4.1 DAY 1 - 17August 1992

An introductory speech was given by Drs. G.M.S. de Silva, Director General, SLSI, and O.S. Peiris, Chairman, SLSI, prior to the commencement of the course.

The course was then introduced by Phil Sharland, who also introduced P-E Batalas to the delegates. Dennis Marshall then invited the delegates to introduce themseives and presented Vocabulary. The Introduction and Evolution of the Standard was presented by Phil Sharland and the two tutors then presented ISO 9001/2, alternating at appropriate times.

The case study was introduced at 16.40 hours and the delegates given the task for the evening. Teams for case study activities were allocated, as detailed in the delegate assessment sheet for the course. Three syndicate rooms were made available fore the delegates to use as teams.

The case study exercise continued until 19.00 hours.

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4.2 DAY 2 - 18 August 1992

The day commenced at 08.30 hours, as scheduled. Feedback from the case study was very constructive.

Presentations were then given on:-Audits Management of Auditing The Assessment The Auditor Auditing Skills Aides Memoire Non-Conformance Report Requirement

During the afternoon a Quality Management video was shown.

The case study was then introduced and commenced, finishing at 19.00 hours.

The day started at 08.20 hours, all delegates being present and eager to proceed.

The case study feedback was conducted, followed by presentations on:-

The course, to date, was then reviewed, any queries from the delegates being clarified.

The case study exercise commenced at 16.30 hours and finished at 19.00 hours.

4.4 DAY 4 - 20 August 1992

The day again started at 08.20 hours.

The case study feedback was conducted, followed by a presentation on Auditing in the Design and Software functions.

In the afternoon the examinations were held and both parts of the examination were attempted by each delegate. The examination papers were marked and adjudicated at the P-E Batalas Romsey office and the results were notified directly to SLSI.

Following the examination, the delegates were briefed on the requirements of the presentations to the mock Board of Directors of Castle Engineering Ltd on the final day.

Preparation for this was completed by 19.00 hours.

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4.5 <u>DAY 5</u>

The presentations to the mock Board of Directors of Castle Engineering Ltd took place. Drs. G.M.S. de Silva and O.S. Peiris kindly agreed to participate as board members, with Dennis Marshall acting as Mr. Warwick, the Managing Director.

Phil Sharland was the observer during this exercise.

It was noted that the standard of presentations by the teams was very high. SLSI should be congratulated on this. and the survey
